Kindergarten:

Third Grade:



This month Valley Forge third graders have been busy preparing for the PSSA tests. Since 3rd grade is the first year students take the PSSAs, we helped them by teaching test-taking strategies and reviewing the type of material that will be on the test. Students have also been busy testing mystery chemicals in Science. They mixed liquids and solids to form chemical reactions and recorded their data in an observation packet. Students have really enjoyed this unit and are learning more and more about ways scientists test and gather information.

In Social Studies, we are continuing to learn about Pennsylvania. This month students received an assignment where they will research and learn about a famous Pennsylvanian. Then on May 1st, students will dress up as their Pennsylvanian and share a speech as this person to their classmates. April will be busy as kids continue to work on reading and writing themes and prepare for Spring Break. We look forward to warmer weather and exciting learning opportunities for our students!


Fourth Grade:

Physical Education

March was an exciting month for Physical Education! Students in grades Kindergarten through 4th grade all participated very well during our gymnastics unit. Gymnastics is a great form of exercise that teaches students about body awareness and helps to improve their overall fitness, especially their muscular strength and flexibility.



3rd and 4th graders have started to take their Fitnessgram assessments and their reports will be sent home with their final report cards at the end of the year. We encourage families to practice pushups, sit-ups, pull-ups, running, and stretching to help build students confidence while taking these assessments. Students are constantly learning

how to increase/maintain their muscular strength, muscular endurance, flexibility, and cardio respiratory endurance as well as learning about body composition. K, 1^{st} and 2^{nd} are practicing different exercises that help with their future fitness assessments.
