February 2013-Team Updates

Kindergarten:

The kindergarten classes woke up February with a PJ and Pancake Day. The students learned the process of making pancakes and followed it up with a written step by step description of the process. We practiced using special words like first, next, then, and last. Having woken up for the month we moved on to writing friendly letters. We learned about the opening, body and closing of a letter. Before the month was over, we also learned about Dental Health. We had a visit from a dental hygienist, Laura Forlano, who met with each class to teach the children about dental health. The children were given a new toothbrush to practice what they learned.

Second Grade:

February began with lots of excitement, as Second Graders participated in a Chinese Round Robin. All were in awe, as this amazing artist created animals and cartoon characters with his swiftly flying scissors and paper plates! From Mrs. Gu, another wondrerful artist, children learned caligraphy and how to hold a brush correctly to create bamboo paintings. Soils is the topic of our current science unit. Students are focusing on learning about three parts of soil: sand , clay , and humus. They are conducting tests to discover the attributes of each type and will be discovering what makes the best soil for planting. We are learning how worms play a valuble part in growing healthy plants and will be testing theories by actually growing seeds in different soils. A compost bin has been created by all classes.

In Social Studies, we are learning about the discovery of the Americas. Ask a second-grader to tell you who discovered America. You may be surprised at the answer! Third Grade:

Special & Support Area Updates

Library-Mrs. Sullivan

Library celebrations have been ongoing. Each month a staff member is chosen to pick the books listed on the bookmark of the month. A student winner of the Spring Fair Raffle will choose the books for the June bookmark. The library will celebrate Dr. Seuss' birthday in the primary division classes with books, games and activities. Kindergarten will hear the first Dr. Seuss book, *And to think that I saw it on Mulberry Street, Horton hears a Who,* and *The Cat in the Hat*; first grade will hear *If I Ran the Zoo* and make strange animal flip books, and second grade will hear *I Wish that I Had Duck Feet,* learn biographical information about Dr. Seuss and do Seussical word searches. We are also beginning to vote for our favorite book as part of our participation in the state-wide Pennsylvania Young Readers Choice Award. Valley Forge students vote in two categories: kindergarten through third grade and third grade through sixth grade.

ourth grade students have been busy working on their PAL projects in the library. Prior to this they used different resources such as World Book Online, World Book Encyclopedia and the World Almanac, answered trivia questions and played games to develop the skills needed for their PAL research.

Third grade students are immersed in locating biographies and listening to biographies. Currently they are working on an autobiography project which requires them to read an autobiography of a children's author and find five interesting facts about the author, locate a book the author has written in the library, read the book and answer the 5Ws about the book, and finally put all the information together.

Kindergarten has been doing author studies using books, Bookflix, Internet sites and worksheets. Some of the authors we will study are Mo Willems, Frank Asch and Jan Brett.

Second grade students have been studying different versions of fairy tales. Some of the highlighted fairy tales were *Cinder*ella, *Rumpelstiltskin*, *Three Billy Goats Gruff* and *Little Red Riding Hood*. Additionally they have been listening to nonfiction stories.

First grade students have been listening to Japanese folk literature, nonfiction and fiction stories. They are working on library terminology: call number, fiction, nonfiction, author, illustrator, spine, cover, etc.

Congratulations to all the students who have been participating in the challenge to read 100 books. Drawings from these participants for a gift certificate to Barnes and Noble will continue to be held until the end of the school year. Keep reading!



Special & Support Area Updates

ESL-Kelly Hess

Valley Forge Elementary School's English Language Learners (ELLs) have been especially busy during the month of February! Students in the ESL Program took the annual ACCESS for ELLs tests. They were assessed in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Our students worked so hard and they should be very proud of themselves!

Now that the testing is over for this year, we are beginning new and exciting units and projects. Kindergarteners are continuing to work in their <u>First 100 Words</u> vocabulary books and journals. We will also be working more with the present progressive tense. Soon we will begin our "Animals" unit, which includes vocabulary and identifying singular and plural items. First grade ELLs are beginning the "Outdoors" unit. They will work on asking about and describing weather, specifying locations, and identifying objects in a location.

We have two second grade groups in ESL. One group is working on the "Comparisons" unit, in which they are comparing objects. The other second grade group is beginning our "People at Home" unit. They will work on identifying and describing family members, and making introductions. Both second grade groups learned about money and enjoyed playing computer and board games that involved "earning" and counting play money.

Third grade ELLs learned about describing amounts with count and non-count foods, and asking/answering questions with count and noncount foods in our "Food" unit. Now they are beginning a new unit, "The Weekend," in which they will learn about and use different aspects of past tense: simple past and past progressive. Fourth grade ELLs learned about using articles (the, a, an), and giving and receiving directions in our "Around Town" unit. Now they will learn about active and passive voice in our "Explore the World" unit.
