STUDENTS: WHICH COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCESS BEST SUITS YOU?

Non-Restrictive Application Plans

Regular Decision

DEFINITION:

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Rolling Admission

DEFINITION:

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Early Action (EA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Restrictive Application Plans

Early Decision (ED)

DEFINITION:

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.

COMMITMENT:

BINDING

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are not restricted from applying to other institutions and have until May 1 to consider their options and confirm enrollment.

Students are responsible for determining and following restrictions.

NACAC Code of Ethics

- Report any high pressure “sales tactics”
- Accept offer by May 1st, unless Early Decision
- Deposit to one school only
- Be prepared for colleges to respond with any of the following decisions:
 - Admit
 - Deny
 - Defer
 - Waitlist
 - Summer/January Admit

Senior “to do” list: September

- Review transcript/return to registrar
- Complete Junior Questionnaire
- Make appointments with teachers to discuss recommendations
- Register for/take final round of SAT/ACT
- Send SAT and/or ACT scores to colleges through collegeboard.org and actstudent.org
- Attend college application drop-in days on September 16th and/or 18th (all periods, room 245)
- Set up a Common Application account – remember username and password
- Sign FERPA waiver on Common Application
- College essays – support available in the Achievement Center, see Mrs. Zahn

September – February

- Schedule an appointment with your counselor
- Work on your applications, send your application when you have completed all parts – *no need to wait for school documents...* School materials will follow your sent application; ****email counselor when sent****
- Review list of visiting colleges on Naviance
- Athletes – register through NCAA Eligibility Center
- Art supplements
- Visit colleges – this is an excused absence – submit a note to attendance
- Check your email for frequent informational messages

College Application Instructions (see blue handout)

- Create Common Application account
- Sign your Transcript Release Form/FERPA
- Add colleges in Naviance (under “Colleges I’m Applying To”)
- Work on applications
- Send your SAT/ACT scores
- Schedule senior meeting with your counselor – 15 days before deadline

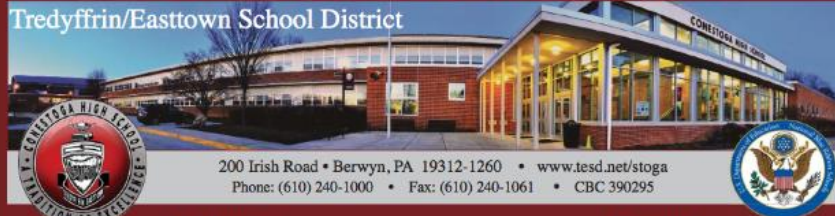

Community

Located 15 miles west of Philadelphia in eastern Chester County, Tredyffrin and Easttown Townships form a suburban school district whose residents primarily engage in professional and business occupations.

Curriculum

Students must earn 24 credits to meet graduation requirements. An individual program is developed for each student, and courses are offered at varying levels of difficulty. In the fall of 2013, 88% of Conestoga students enrolled in at least one Honors level course, and 53% of Conestoga students enrolled in at least one Advanced Placement (AP) course.

Independent study, self-directed learning, and other enrichment opportunities are available in all disciplines. Qualifying seniors (98%) participate in a four-week internship program in May and June.

Instructional Levels

Students are grouped by instructional levels in all academic departments: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, and World Languages.

Levels are designated on the transcript as follows:
AP/H* Advanced Placement H Honors X Accelerated A Academic
Students are heterogeneously grouped in other departments, except where Advanced Placement courses are offered.

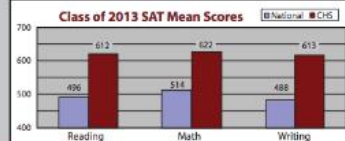

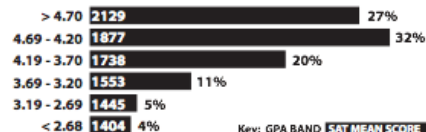
Grade Point Average (GPA)

The GPA is cumulative, including only leveled courses taken at Conestoga valued at 0.5 credit or more. The Unweighted GPA is reported on the transcript along with the Weighted GPA.

Weighted/Unweighted GPA

The **Unweighted GPA** is computed on a traditional 4.0 system in which grades are valued as follows: A (90-100) 4.0, B (80-89) 3.0, C (70-79) 2.0, D (65-69) 1.0. The **Weighted GPA** is adjusted to reflect levels of instruction.

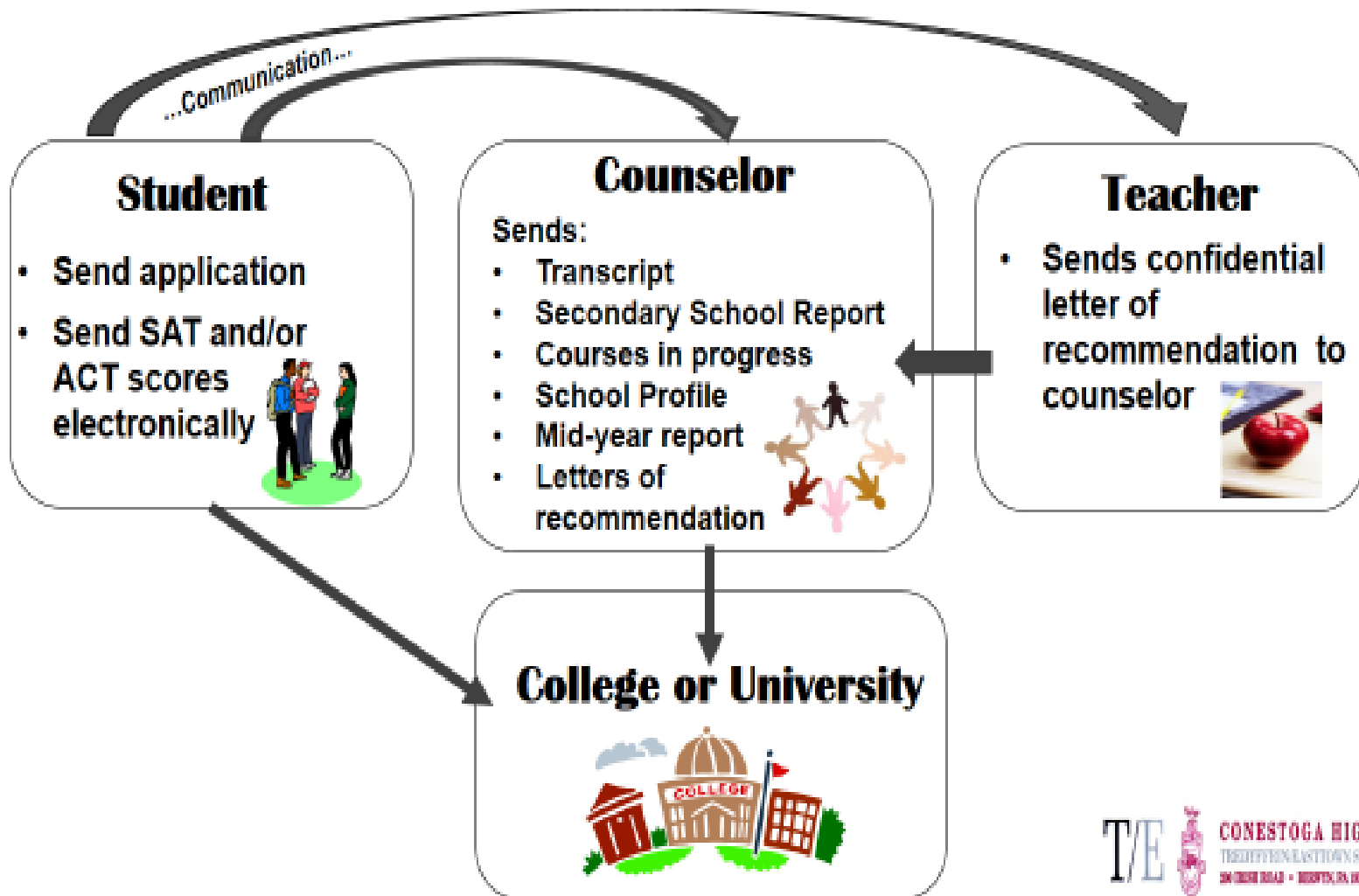
