Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors for the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District adopts the following resolutions that pertain to the approval of the 2015– 2016 Final Budget submitted by the District administration:

WHEREAS, a Final Budget for the 2015 – 2016 school year has been prepared for and submitted to the Board of School Directors for the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District for its consideration; and,

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed and fully considered said Final Budget; and,

WHEREAS, ten days' public notice has been given of the adoption of the said Final Budget; and,

WHEREAS, said Final Budget has been printed or otherwise made available for public inspection to all persons who might have an interest therein, at least twenty days prior to the date of this resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of School Directors has made such revision and changes to said Final Budget as appear advisable;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of School Directors for the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District, Wayne, Chester County, Pennsylvania, and

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by authority of the same as follows:
The Final Budget for the 2015 – 2016 school year in the amount of \$122,719,325 revenues, \$3,154,836 fund balance allocation, and \$125,874,161 for expenditures is hereby adopted as the annual budget.

In order to provide a segment of the revenue required by said Final Budget, a school tax on real estate is hereby levied for the ensuing fiscal year on all real property assessed and certified for taxation within the School District.

The 2015 – 2016 tax hereby levied shall be at the rate of 20.9868 mills, on the assessed valuation of all such taxable real estate or at the rate of \$20.9868 per \$1,000 assessment subject to the discount and/or penalty provisions prescribed by the laws of this Commonwealth. This is an increase of .7697 mills from the 2014 – 2015 tax rate.

At the April 27, 2015 meeting of the Board of School Directors, the 2015 – 2016 Proposed Final Budget was adopted. The 2015 – 2016 Proposed Final Budget was made available for public inspection in the Tredyffrin/Easttown Administration Offices and posted on the District website. The adoption of the 2015 – 2016 Final Budget has been appropriately advertised.

- ◆ **What does the Taxpayer Relief Act of 2006 give to voters in each school district?**
 - Power over extraordinary tax increases – Voters in every school district will have the final say on extraordinary tax increases. **School boards will still be able to raise property taxes each year to keep up with inflation, and they can receive referendum exceptions for emergencies and educational necessities.** But after that, tax increases will require voter approval.

- ◆ **What are the referendum exceptions in the Taxpayer Relief Act?**
 - Act 1 includes sensible and flexible referendum requirements that protect homeowners while ensuring that school districts can afford to adequately fund their schools. In order to increase property taxes beyond the inflation index (Act 1 Index), a school board must receive a referendum exception for specific costs.
 - Two of those referendum exceptions are:
 - 1) Special education costs that increase by more than the index
 - 2) Increases in retirement payments that rise faster than the index

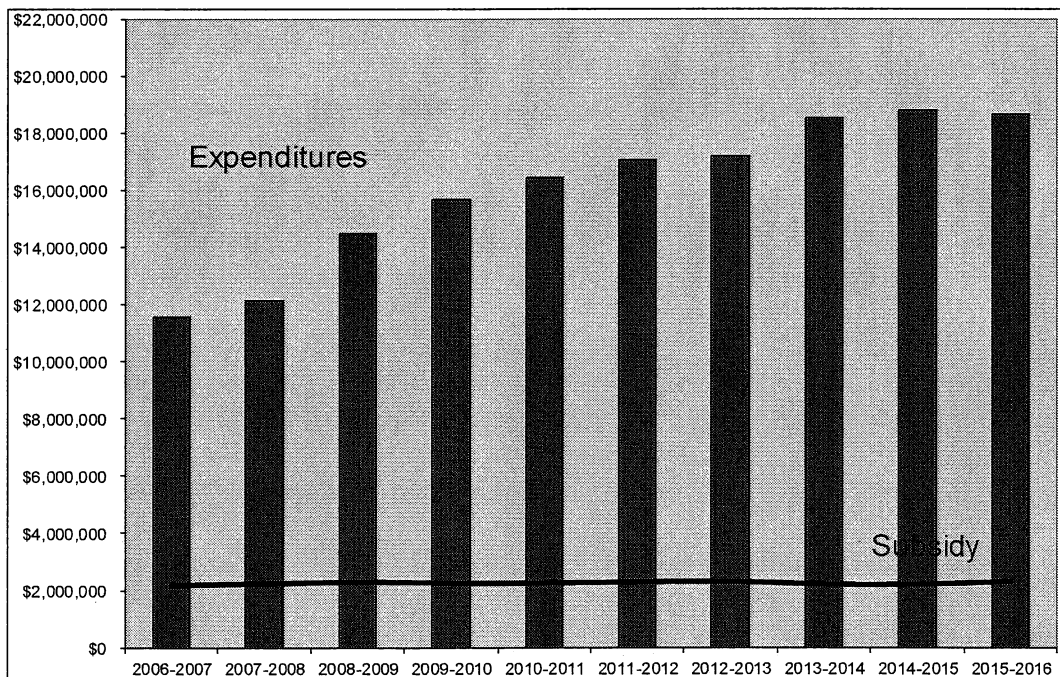

WHEREAS, a Final Budget for the 2015 – 2016 school year has been prepared for and submitted to the Board of School Directors for the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District for its consideration; and,

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed and fully considered said Final Budget; and,

WHEREAS, ten days' public notice has been given of the adoption of the said Final Budget; and,

WHEREAS, said Final Budget has been printed or otherwise made available for public inspection to all persons who might have an interest therein, at least twenty days prior to the date of this resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of School Directors has made such revision and changes to said Final Budget as appear advisable;

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In order to provide a segment of the revenue required by said Final Budget, a school tax on real estate is hereby levied for the ensuing fiscal year on all real property assessed and certified for taxation within the School District.

The 2015 – 2016 tax hereby levied shall be at the rate of 20.9868 mills, on the assessed valuation of all such taxable real estate or at the rate of \$20.9868 per \$1,000 assessment subject to the discount and/or penalty provisions prescribed by the laws of this Commonwealth. This is an increase of .7697 mills from the 2014 – 2015 tax rate.





Consent VI, E, 3: Tax Bill Homestead/Farmstead Exclusion

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors for the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District adopts the following resolutions which pertains to the approval of the Tax Bill Homestead/Farmstead Exclusion for the 2015 – 2016 fiscal year:

WHEREAS, the County Assessor has certified to the School District that there are 11,624 approved homestead properties in the School District and 4 approved farmstead properties in the school district for the 2015 – 2016 fiscal year; and,

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Department of Education has certified that the School District's Property Tax Reduction Allocation for the 2015 – 2016 fiscal year is \$2,099,834.39.

In accordance with the Special Session Act 1 of 2006, known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, the Board of School Directors hereby establishes the following homestead/farmstead exclusion for the 2015 – 2016 fiscal year:

1. All approved homesteads and/or farmsteads shall receive a homestead/farmstead exclusion of \$8,605.00 of the assessed value of the homestead and/or farmstead, which, based upon the millage rate established for the 2015 – 2016 fiscal year, corresponds to a tax reduction of \$180.59.
2. The annual property tax bill for each approved homestead and/or farmstead shall include the following information with respect to the homestead/farmstead exclusion: (a) the assessed value, (b) the tax liability on the assessed value, (c) the amount of the homestead/farmstead exclusion in assessed value, (d) the actual tax liability after the homestead/farmstead exclusion and (e) the actual tax savings associated with the homestead/ farmstead exclusion.
3. The following notice shall also be included with the annual property tax bills of all owners of approved homestead and/or farmstead properties:

NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

Your enclosed tax bill includes a tax reduction for your homestead and/or farmstead property. As an eligible homestead and/or farmstead property owner, you have received tax relief through a homestead and/or farmstead exclusion which has been provided under the Pennsylvania Taxpayer Relief Act, a law passed by the Pennsylvania General Assembly designed to reduce your property taxes.

These provisions shall apply to the annual property tax bills issued in July 2015 and not to any interim real estate tax bill.

This agreement covers reimbursement for tuition for the 2015-2016 School Year, including Extended School Year, in an amount not to exceed \$36,905.

The District has offered an appropriate program for this student. The District and the family have agreed to the terms in this Educational Services Agreement. This agreement reimburses the family for student placement in lieu of an offer of a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) and includes a release of prior special education claims up to the end date of the agreement. The agreement has been reviewed and recommended by the District's Solicitor.

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves an Educational Services Agreement for a District student with special needs to attend a non-traditional placement. This agreement covers reimbursement for tuition for the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years, including Extended School Year, in an amount not to exceed \$17,730.

This student requires a specialized program to meet the student's unique needs. The District has offered an appropriate placement for this student. The family is not in agreement with the District's recommendation. In order to work collaboratively and avoid protracted dispute, the District and family have agreed to the terms in this Educational Services Agreement. This agreement reimburses the family for a placement of their choice in lieu of an offer of a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) and includes a release of prior special education claims up to the end date of the agreement. The agreement has been reviewed and recommended by the District's Solicitor.

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves an Educational Services Agreement for a District student with special needs. This agreement covers reimbursement for educational services for the 2015 Extended School Year from June 19, 2015 through September 1, 2015 in an amount not to exceed \$5,880.

The District has offered an appropriate placement for this student. The District and the family have agreed to the terms in this Educational Services Agreement. This agreement reimburses the family for student placement in lieu of an offer of a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) and includes a release of prior special education claims up to the end date of the agreement. The agreement has been reviewed and recommended by the District's Solicitor.

Consent VI, F, 2: Contracts with Approved Private Schools

VIA: Andrea Chipego, Director of Individualized Student Services

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves a contract between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District and an Approved Private School to provide mandated services for five (5) District students, including one-to one aide services for one student. This contract covers Extended School Year from July 6, 2015 through August 7, 2015 at a total cost of \$40,440.

These students with special needs require mandated Extended School Year services, which are a continuation of the programs provided during the school year at the Approved Private School.

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves a contract between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District and an Approved Private School to provide mandated services for six (6) District students. This contract covers Extended School Year from July 1, 2015 through August 12, 2015 at a total cost of \$30,542.

These students with special needs require mandated Extended School Year services, which are a continuation of the programs provided during the school year at the Approved Private School.

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves a contract between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District and an Approved Private School to provide mandated services for three (3) District students. This contract covers the 2015-2016 School Year at a total cost of \$154,725.

These students with special needs require an intensive program of special education services and supports that exceed the capability of his/her neighborhood school. The Approved Private School ordinarily would receive 60% of the annual tuition rate through state funding, with districts funding the remaining 40%. For 2015-2016, State funding is not available for these students, therefore, the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District will fund 100% of the tuition for these students. State funding will be applied as it becomes available, but this is not anticipated within the next three years. It may be necessary to request ACCESS or District contingency funds to fully support this cost. The District has also applied for State grant funding to support extraordinary special education costs.

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves a contract between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District and an Approved Private School to provide mandated IEP based services for four (4) District students with intense special support needs. This contract covers Extended School Year from July 6, 2015 through August 14, 2015 and IEP based services for students during the 2015-2016 school year from August 31, 2015 to June 14, 2016 with the total cost to the District of \$206,265.

These students with severe special needs require an intensive program of special education services and supports that exceed the capability of their neighborhood schools and exceed the APS regular tuition costs. It may be necessary to request ACCESS or District contingency funds to fully support this cost. The District has also applied for State grant funding to support extraordinary special education costs.

Consent VI, F, 3: Agreement for Support Services

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves a intense support services for a District student for the 2014-2015 school year at a total amount not to exceed \$31,023.

This student currently placed at an Approved Private School, has multiple disabilities and requires intensive support services in order to access his/her educational program.

**Agreement for Services
Between
Tredyffrin/Easttown School District
and
Delta-T Group, Inc.**

THIS AGREEMENT, dated as of July 1, 2015, is entered into by and between **Tredyffrin/Easttown School District**, a Pennsylvania public school entity having an address at 940 West Valley Road, Suite 1700, Wayne, PA, PA 19087 (“T/ESD”); and **DELTA-T GROUP, INC.**, a Pennsylvania corporation having an address at 950 Haverford Road, Suite 200, Bryn Mawr, PA 19010 (“Delta-T”).

BACKGROUND:

WHEREAS, T/ESD provides educational services, instructional support services and other similar services; and

WHEREAS, Delta-T is organized to provide support for educational services by referring contractor’s who are aides, paraprofessionals, paraeducators, and other instructional support services (“Paraprofessionals”) as requested by T/ESD, including but not limited to clerical support, supervision of children, assistance of professional staff; and other non-teaching duties.

WHEREAS, T/ESD hereby desires to engage Delta-T to provide these referral services (“Services”) to T/ESD at the request and direction of T/ESD, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, and intending to be legally bound hereby, T/ESD and Delta-T hereby agree as follows:

1. **Term of Agreement.** The term of this Agreement (the “Term”) shall commence on the date hereof and shall terminate on June 30, 2020; provided, however, that the Term of this Agreement shall automatically renew for successive one (1) year periods unless and until either party shall terminate this Agreement. Notwithstanding the termination of this Agreement, certain provisions in this Agreement may survive termination.

2. **Services of Delta-T.** T/ESD hereby agrees to engage Delta-T, and Delta-T hereby agrees to be engaged by T/ESD, as an independent Contractor to provide the Services identified on Schedule “A” hereto for T/ESD at the request or direction of T/ESD. T/ESD and Delta-T may change the Services to be provided by Delta-T to T/ESD hereunder, from time to time, by preparing, executing and affixing a new Schedule “A” hereto, whereupon the services described on the new Schedule “A” shall be deemed to be the Services to be provided by

Delta-T to T/ESD hereunder. Delta-T shall endeavor to complete all Services in a high quality manner consistent with the requirements of this Agreement.

3. **Compensation for Services.** For and in consideration of the provision of the Services by DELTA-T as provided herein, T/ESD shall pay to DELTA-T the fees (the “Fees”) for such Services as are set forth on Schedule “A” hereto. T/ESD and DELTA-T may change the Fees to be paid by T/ESD to DELTA-T for the services to be provided by DELTA-T hereunder, from time to time, by preparing, executing and affixing a new Schedule “A” hereto, whereupon the fees described on the new Schedule “A” shall be deemed to be the Fees to be paid by T/ESD to DELTA-T for the Services provided by DELTA-T hereunder. In the event that the Public School Employees’ Retirement System (PSERS) imposes any employer charges or makes a claim for employer charges directed to DELTA-T as the result of providing any services to T/ESD, T/ESD shall be responsible to pay any and all such penalties or contribution charges to DELTA-T in accordance with the payment of fees provision set forth above. This provision shall also survive termination of this Agreement or the term of this Agreement.

4. **Credentials.** Every Contractor referred by Delta-T to perform Services under this Agreement shall be required to pass a State criminal background check fully compliant with all of the requirements of applicable PA regulations without cost to the T/ESD, prior to assignment to the T/ESD. The Company shall provide written proof to the Board that each Contractor has passed its criminal background check and is not disqualified per T/ESD specifications. The Company agrees that under Pennsylvania law each Paraprofessional assigned to work at the T/ESD must obtain the following security clearances:

- FBI Background Check
- Child/Student Abuse Report/Clearance
- Pennsylvania Criminal History Background Check
- Arrest/Conviction Report and Certification PDE Form 6004 (under Act 24 of 2011)

No Contractor shall be permitted onto a T/ESD property or into a T/ESD facility without first providing satisfactory written evidence of each clearance listed above.

Delta-T shall notify T/ESD any time it becomes aware that a referred Contractor is arrested or charged with a criminal offense. Such notice shall be provided in writing on a PDE Form 6004 and within seventy-two (72) hours of the arrest or conviction.

Delta-T agrees to conduct an employment history review for each referred Contractor as required by Act 168 of 2014 and maintain documentation of such employment history review as required by Act 168. Delta-T shall maintain documentation of such employment history review for each referred Contractor and T/ESD shall have the right to inspect such documentation upon request.

5. **Payment of Fees** DELTA-T shall submit monthly written invoices to T/ESD for the Fees payable, as outlined in Exhibit “A”, attached, for the Services provided during the previous month. All Fees payable by T/ESD to DELTA-T shall be paid by T/ESD within thirty (30) calendar days following receipt by T/ESD of an invoice from DELTA-T therefor. All invoices from DELTA-T to T/ESD shall be accompanied by the T/ESD authorized invoices (signed off on by T/ESD representative in accordance with the terms and conditions

of this Agreement) from the Contractor and other documentation as shall be reasonably necessary for T/ESD to confirm the Services provided and the Fees payable in connection therewith and otherwise in a form agreed upon by DELTA-T and T/ESD. If there is a dispute concerning any invoice, T/ESD shall withhold only the amount in dispute until the dispute is resolved.

If DELTA-T so elects, when payment is not received in full within these terms, then the unpaid balance shall be subject to statutory interest and a late charge computed at one and one half percent (1 1/2%) monthly until payment is made in full. T/ESD further agrees to pay reasonable attorney's fees and other costs incurred for collection. Failure of T/ESD to pay DELTA-T's brokerage fees constitutes a material breach of this Agreement and DELTA-T, in its sole discretion, may cease referring Paraprofessionals until payment is received in full.

T/ESD shall notify Delta-T within five (5) business days of receipt of Delta-T invoice, whether Contractor has provided T/ESD with the requisite documentation. If notice of a dispute is given within this time frame, Delta-T shall, at the request of T/ESD, act as a liaison in communicating with Contractor with regard to his/her completion of the missing documentation. If no notice is given within five (5) business days, then T/ESD shall be solely responsible for obtaining any such missing or incomplete documentation and payment to Delta-T shall be made in accordance with the terms stated herein and irrespective of whether proper documentation has been provided.

6. Relationship of Parties; Performance of Services

It is hereby understood and agreed that DELTA-T is, and in performing the Services under this Agreement, acting in the capacity of, an Independent Contractor of T/ESD, and that DELTA-T is not an agent, servant, partner, joint venturer, shareholder or employee of T/ESD. Subject to any reasonable rules and regulations established by T/ESD with regard to the performance of the Services, DELTA-T shall be free to exercise DELTA-T's discretion and judgment as to the manner in which DELTA-T performs the Services hereunder. DELTA-T hereby acknowledges that DELTA-T has been advised by T/ESD that, as an Independent Contractor of T/ESD under this Agreement, DELTA-T is responsible for the payment of all of DELTA-T's own Federal taxes and those of its employees, including, but not limited to, income and self-employment taxes (FICA), together with any and all corresponding Federal, state and local employment and other taxes, if any, and DELTA-T hereby agrees to promptly satisfy such obligations. DELTA-T hereby waives and releases T/ESD from any claim which DELTA-T has or may have against T/ESD now or in the future respecting such taxes, and indemnifies, waives and releases T/ESD from any claim that T/ESD is obligated to withhold, pay or contribute to or on account of such taxes on behalf of DELTA-T. Each party hereto shall advise its employees that they are not the employees of the other party hereto, and are not entitled to such employment, unless and until such employees are hired by T/ESD and they are notified in writing to that effect. In no event shall DELTA-T and T/ESD be deemed "joint employers." Each of the parties hereto are solely responsible to hire, assign, promote, discipline, and terminate its own employees. Neither party has the authority or power to, and shall not represent itself to have the power to, pledge, assign, bind, waive or otherwise obligate the other party hereto or any of its officers, directors, employees, agents,

representatives, members, assets, properties or rights. Irrespective of the relationship of Delta-T with any other party, should a Court or Arbiter determine that with regard to the referred Paraprofessionals that there is an employment relationship, then it is agreed that Delta-T and not the District would be the Common Law Employer. In addition to the other duties and responsibilities of DELTA-T as set forth herein, it is agreed that DELTA-T will provide appropriate resources and administrative services with respect to the referred Paraprofessionals performing services for T/ESD.

- a) All Contractors referred to T/ESD by Delta-T will be required to meet with the T/ESD's Director of Human Resources or designee for a pre-engagement meeting. After completion of said meeting, T/ESD will notify DELTA-T as to its approval or disapproval accepting the Contractor to perform services for the T/ESD.
- b) At the sole discretion of the T/ESD, T/ESD may, without cause or prejudice, deny engagement with a prospective Contractor or cause removal of such Contractor providing services at T/ESD, provided that such denial or removal is lawful.
- c) T/ESD shall not refuse to accept the services of any Delta-T referred Contractor, and DELTA-T shall not refuse to source or engage with any prospective Contractor on the basis of his/her gender, sexual orientation, race, color, age, religion, national origin, or disability that can reasonably be accommodated, or for any other illegal reason.
- d) DELTA-T is responsible to engage, coordinate and refer Paraprofessionals with the T/ESD required credentials to carry out the duties DELTA-T is contracted to perform, or on behalf of T/ESD under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- e) At the sole discretion of the T/ESD, DELTA-T shall, without cause or prejudice, deny referral of a Paraprofessional or cause removal of a Paraprofessional upon request of the District.
- f) Delta-T retains the right to visit the work site and obtain input from the supervising employee of the District on how well the referred Paraprofessionals are meeting District expectations regarding conduct and performance and the extent to which they are following District policies and procedures. Based on input and District requests, Delta-T shall discuss any needed areas of improvement with the Paraprofessional and/or pull the Paraprofessional from an engagement when no longer meeting District needs. DELTA-T shall be responsible to T/ESD for the acts and omissions of DELTA-T referred Paraprofessionals, subcontractors and their respective agents and employees, and other persons and entities performing any of the services for or on behalf of DELTA-T or any of its subcontractors. DELTA-T shall support all T/ESD policies and procedures for appropriate conduct while at District performing services and retains the right to review with the Paraprofessionals the expectations of conduct while they are performing services for the District according to the T/ESD's policies and procedures and how well they were conducting themselves based on the T/ESD expectations, policies and procedures.

7. Delta-T's Obligations

- a) Delta-T will exercise due diligence and act in good faith to refer Paraprofessionals who have the following credentials as specified in advance in writing by T/ESD: a) applicable educational requirements, (b) the requisite experience, (c) proficiency in word processing, spreadsheets/ internet data bases and communication software (email and calendaring), (d) completed criminal history checks as required by law from the PA Department of Education, (e) T/ESD specified inoculations and tuberculosis testing as required by the State of PA Department of Education and (f) compliance with applicable laws and procedures of the State, the policies, rules and regulations of the Board and this Agreement. T/ESD acknowledges that any referred Contractor previously employed by the T/ESD that is subsequently referred by Delta-T will be ineligible to accept an engagement with T/ESD unless the prospective Contractor satisfies the State of Pennsylvania regulations and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- b) Delta-T will identify, source and credential Contractors who will provide the support services to T/ESD hereunder. Delta-T will ensure that the referred Paraprofessionals possess the credentials specified herein, to provide the requested services prior to rendering such services.
- c) All Paraprofessionals referred to T/ESD by Delta-T shall have the requisite trainings and licenses, as specified by T/ESD to perform all of the duties and tasks as assigned and according to the necessary credentials specified by T/ESD to conduct their work in a professional manner. All referred Paraprofessionals shall be properly credentialed, as specified by T/ESD, to perform the requested services. Either party shall have the right to request that any Contractor violating the standards of conduct of T/ESD to be taken off of the engagement.
- d) The parties expect the referred Paraprofessionals to perform their services in a satisfactory manner. If the District notifies Delta-T that Contractor has not performed satisfactorily within the reasonable discretion of the District and the District administration wishes to have the Contractor replaced, Delta-T shall honor the District's request to replace in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and will refrain from referring the particular Contractor to the District. Delta-T shall endeavor to identify a prospective replacement within twenty-four (24) hours of receiving notice from the District.
- e) Delta-T shall cooperate in providing reports when requested by District relating to the referred Paraprofessionals and/or the credentials of the referred Paraprofessionals as reasonably necessary (including available schedule and/or compensation data).
- f) Delta-T shall endeavor to maintain the continuity of the referred Paraprofessional provided under this Agreement and shall refrain from transferring or reassigning the Paraprofessional (within the District locations or to outside third parties), so long as the District is otherwise satisfied with the referred Paraprofessional so assigned. Delta-T shall endeavor to identify and refer a substitute Contractor in the event that Delta-T learns that a regularly assigned Contractor will be absent from his/her assignment.
- g) DELTA-T shall perform the Services under this Agreement in strict accordance with all applicable Laws.

8. The District's Obligations

In connection with Paraprofessionals referred by Delta-T pursuant to this Agreement, the District shall:

- a) Immediately notify Delta-T of any and all job offers made to Paraprofessionals that were referred to you by Delta-T. Delta-T's Temp to Perm Policy is that from the time Client notifies Delta-T of its intention to hire or contract directly with a Contractor, the Contractor must work five hundred (500) hours through Delta-T. Client may hire or contract with Contractor without meeting this 500-hour requirement by making payment to Delta-T the sum of \$5,000.00 or a sum equal to 1/3 of the total compensation package (including bonuses and fringe benefits) offered to Contractor, whichever sum is greater. This 500-hour requirement remains in effect for a period of six (6) months after the last date of a Contractor's assignment with Client.
- b) Provide a safe and suitable workplace that complies with all applicable safety and health standards, statutes, and regulations.
- c) Provide Paraprofessionals with adequate information, specific training on any specialized software or programs to be used by Paraprofessional and safety equipment with respect to any inherent dangers of the workplace, including emergency procedures, school and office rules and protocols, policies and procedures regarding school office policies and procedures and regulations, and confidentiality of student records and school data.
- d) Further, the District will provide all Paraprofessionals with any training appropriate to the needs, duties, responsibilities or knowledge needed to work in the District or is otherwise different than would generally be appropriate in other districts or other Contractor assignments within the District.
- e) Maintain appropriate written internal control policies and procedures to ensure the confidentiality of all student records and appropriately limit (to the extent reasonably possible) Paraprofessionals' access to such records.
- f) Approve and sign invoices submitted by Paraprofessionals documenting the services performed (including dates and times).
- g) All Delta-T referred Paraprofessionals will be required to comply with Pennsylvania Department of Education's Act 126 - Child Abuse Recognition and Reporting Act, Act 168 of 2014, and Act 22 – Special Education Services and Programs. The T/ESD shall assist in coordinating educational opportunities for DELTA-T referred Paraprofessionals serving within the District and will reimburse DELTA-T for cost associated with the sessions.
- h) DELTA-T shall be responsible to T/ESD for the acts and omissions of DELTA-T' employees and other persons and entities performing any of the Services for or on behalf of DELTA-T.

9. Indemnification

To the extent permitted by applicable Laws, DELTA-T shall indemnify, hold harmless and, if so requested, defend T/ESD and its employees, officers, directors, agents, representatives and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives, successors and

assigns (collectively, the “Indemnitees”) from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, liabilities, suits, charges, fines, taxes, fees, judgments, actions, causes of action, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys’ fees) (collectively “Damages”) imposed upon or incurred by T/ESD to the extent arising out of any of the following: (i) Delta-T’s failure to comply with its obligations under any applicable laws, regulations or orders; (ii) Delta-T’s breach of any obligation contained in this Agreement; (iii) any negligent act or omission of Delta-T’s employee, officer, or agent; or (iv) any direct claim for workers’ compensation benefits for bodily injury arising out of an injury that occurs to a referred Contractor while performing services for T/ESD which may be asserted against T/ESD.

Delta-T will comply with all provisions of the Affordable Care Act (“ACA”), including the employer shared responsibility provisions relating to the offer of “minimum essential coverage” to “full time” employees (as those terms are defined for purposes of Internal Revenue Code section 4908H and related regulations) and the applicable employer information-reporting provisions under Code sections 6055 and 6056 and related regulations.

The Company shall be solely responsible for, and shall reimburse, indemnify, and hold harmless the District (hereinafter referred to as “District Indemnity”) for any taxes, penalties, or other liabilities assessed against the Company or the District under Code section 4980H with respect to assigned Paraprofessionals due to the Company’s failure to:

1. Offer “minimum essential coverage” under an “eligible employer-sponsored plan” within the meaning of Code section 5000A(f)(1)(B); or
2. Offer coverage that is not “affordable” or fails to provide “minimum value,” each within the meaning of Code section 36B(c)(2)(C) and 4980H(b) and related regulations.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no event shall the District Indemnity extend to any taxes, penalties, or other liabilities under Code section 4980H where such tax, penalty, or other liability results from the imposition of penalties under (a) Code section 4908H(a) as a result of a failure of the District to make offers of minimum essential coverage to its employees under an eligible employer-sponsored plan, or (b) Code section 4980H(b) as a result of the District making an offer of minimum essential coverage to its employees under an eligible employer-sponsored plan that is either unaffordable or fails to provide minimum value or (c) as the result of the Internal Revenue Service or any other jurisdictional body determining that the Company’s employees are deemed to be common-law employees of the District as the result of a misclassification of any employee’s status or joint employment status between District and the Company.

If the District is notified by any governmental entity of the District’s potential liability for any such taxes, penalties, or other liabilities relating to the assigned Paraprofessionals, the Company shall fully cooperate with the District’s efforts to object to or appeal any such determination of liability or potential liability.

10. **Insurance.**

a. Unless waived in writing by T/ESD, DELTA-T shall purchase from and maintain with a reputable company or companies lawfully licensed and authorized to do

business in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, upon such terms and conditions as are satisfactory to DELTA-T, in its sole discretion, the following policies of insurance:

(i) comprehensive commercial liability insurance insuring against claims for damages resulting from bodily injury, sickness or disease of any person and claims for damages or injury to or destruction of property, and all other claims customarily covered under a comprehensive policy, with limits not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and subject to an aggregate limit of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) per annum;

(ii) Occupational Accident Insurance for all Paraprofessionals referred to T/ESD as well as a Contingent Liability Policy to provide coverage in the event that a Contractor is injured while performing services at a T/ESD site and subsequently files a Worker's Compensation Claim;

b. Coverages, whether written on an occurrence or claims-made basis, shall be maintained without interruption from the date of commencement of the Services until the date of final payment of the Fee. Certificates of insurance, evidencing the insurance required herein, shall be filed with T/ESD prior to commencement of the Services, and as otherwise requested by T/ESD. The certificates of insurance provided to T/ESD hereunder shall provide that coverage afforded under the applicable policies will not be cancelled, modified or allowed to expire until at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to T/ESD.

c. DELTA-T hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the Indemnitees for damages to the extent covered by insurance maintained or required to be maintained by DELTA-T hereunder. All policies of insurance secured by DELTA-T hereunder shall include waivers of subrogation against the Indemnitees.

8. **Nondiscrimination/Sexual Harassment/Americans with Disabilities Act.**

During the Term, DELTA-T hereby agrees as follows:

a. In the registering and sourcing of any Paraprofessionals for the performance of any of the Services, DELTA-T, or any person acting on behalf of DELTA-T, shall not by reason of gender, sexual orientation, race, color, age, religion, national origin, or disability discriminate against any person who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates.

b. Neither DELTA-T, nor any person acting on behalf of DELTA-T, shall discriminate against or intimidate any Contractor involved in the performance of work or any activity required under this Agreement on account of gender, sexual orientation, race, color, age, religion, national origin, or disability.

c. DELTA-T shall establish and maintain a written sexual harassment policy and shall inform its employees of the policy. The policy must contain a notice that sexual harassment will not be tolerated and employees who practice it will be disciplined. A copy of this policy and all updates thereto shall be provided to T/ESD.

d. DELTA-T understands and agrees that it shall not cause any individual with a disability to be excluded from participation in this Agreement or from providing or receiving any Services under this Agreement on the basis of a disability.

9. **Intellectual Property.** Neither T/ESD nor DELTA-T shall assert any ownership rights in any of the intellectual property of the other party. T/ESD hereby grants to DELTA-T a royalty-free, non-exclusive, non-transferable license for use of any of T/ESD's intellectual property to the extent necessary for DELTA-T to provide the Services as contemplated under this Agreement.

10. **Assignment and Subcontracting.** This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. DELTA-T shall not assign, in whole or in part, this Agreement or its rights, duties, obligations, or responsibilities hereunder without prior written consent of T/ESD, which consent may be withheld at the sole discretion of T/ESD. DELTA-T shall not subcontract with any person or entity to perform all or any part of the work to be performed under this Agreement without the prior written consent of T/ESD, which consent may be withheld at the sole discretion of T/ESD.

11. **Termination.** T/ESD and DELTA-T shall each have the right to terminate this Agreement, for any or no reason, at any time, upon no less than ninety (90) days prior written notice thereof to the other party. Upon the delivery of written notice of termination by either party, DELTA-T shall promptly cease performance of the Services except for those Services reasonably required to transition responsibility for said Services over to T/ESD, and shall provide an accounting thereof through the termination date.

12. Governing Law and Attorney's Fees.

The parties agree that any dispute concerning this Agreement shall be resolved according to the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, without regard to any other jurisdictions choice of law rules, and shall be brought in the state or federal courts of Pennsylvania. The prevailing party in any action at law or in equity that is brought to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Agreement shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and all reasonable costs associated therewith.

13. Miscellaneous.

a. All schedules, exhibits and attachments hereto are hereby incorporated herein by this reference and shall be deemed to be a part of this Agreement as if they physically appeared within it.

b. Unless otherwise provided herein, any notice to be given hereunder by any party to the other shall be in writing and effective when delivered personally or by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested or overnight courier or confirmed facsimile transaction, addressed to the address for such party set forth above, or to such other place and with such other copies as either party may designate as to itself by written notice to the others listed above.

c. This Agreement shall be construed, interpreted and the rights of the parties determined in accordance with and governed by the applicable Laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, without regard to conflicts of laws principles. It is expressly agreed and stipulated that this Agreement is deemed to have been made in Pennsylvania. Any action or proceeding seeking to enforce any provision of, or based on any right arising

out of this Agreement may be brought against either of the parties solely in the courts of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in and for the County of Chester. The parties hereto consent and hereby submit to the jurisdiction of said courts (and of the appropriate appellate courts) in any such action or proceeding and waives any objection to venue therein; provided, however, that T/ESD may commence suit in any other forum if necessary to protect or enforce its rights hereunder. Process in any action or proceeding referred to in the preceding sentence may be served on any party, by certified mail in lieu of personal service.

d. This Agreement, together with all schedules and exhibits hereto, constitutes the entire agreement among the parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements, understandings, negotiations and discussions, whether oral or written, of the parties. No supplement, modification or waiver of this Agreement shall be binding unless executed in writing by the party or parties to be bound thereby.

e. This Agreement is for the benefit of, and may be enforced only by the parties hereto and their respective affiliates, and is not for the benefit of, and may not be enforced by, any other party, except the Indemnitees or as otherwise expressly provided herein.

f. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

g. In the event that any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement or in any other instrument referred to herein, shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Agreement or any other such instrument.

h. The headings of the Sections herein are inserted for convenience of reference only and are not intended to be a part of or to affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.

i. All costs and expenses incurred in connection with negotiation, preparation, execution, delivery, performance and enforcement of this Agreement and consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby shall be borne and paid by the party incurring such expenses.

j. The rights and remedies of the parties to this Agreement are cumulative and not exclusive of any rights or remedies which the parties would otherwise have. No single or partial exercise of any such right or remedy by a party, and no discontinuation of steps to enforce any such right or remedy, shall preclude any further exercise thereof or of any other right or remedy of such party.

k. All covenants and agreements of the parties set forth herein shall continue in full force and effect from and after the date hereof until such date as all of such covenants and agreements have been satisfied in full or waived, or this Agreement has otherwise been terminated, except for such covenants and agreements as survive such termination by their own terms.

Complaints Regarding the District

Complaints concerning the District's programs or operations should be directed to the staff member or the administrator immediately in charge of the area in which the complaint arises. Board members who receive complaints concerning the District's programs or operations will encourage the complainants to follow this same procedure.

Complaints received anonymously by the District, by the Board or by its members will not be recognized as formal correspondence; and therefore, typically will not be given a response.

The Superintendent shall promulgate Administrative Regulations detailing the process and procedures District personnel will follow for handling complaints received by the District.

Special procedures provided by law or other District policy for handling complaints in certain areas such as discrimination, sexual harassment, and resolving issues of concern for non-contract staff shall supersede the provisions of this ~~policy~~Policy and its accompanying regulation.

Since the District requires its employees to make mandatory reports to law enforcement and other agencies for suspected child abuse, possible violation of criminal law and educator misconduct, among other required reports, complaints regarding the District's referral of matters to governmental agencies shall not be subject to the procedures required by this Policy.

The Superintendent shall promulgate guidelines implementing this Policy, which shall require all volunteers to:

1. maintain the privacy of confidential student information; and
2. respect the authority of the teacher or supervisor overseeing the volunteers; ~~and~~

In addition, the Superintendent shall promulgate guidelines implementing this Policy, which shall require volunteers responsible for the welfare of children or having direct contact with children to:

1. provide all criminal and child abuse clearances required by law as set forth in the accompanying administrative regulation. Only those volunteers deemed acceptable to the Superintendent or his or her designee shall be appointed; and-
2. report all incidents of suspected child abuse in accordance with law.

Nonresident Students – Enrollment Eligibility

The Tredyffrin/Easttown School District (TESD) operates for the benefit of resident children eligible for enrollment. Students are only eligible to enroll in TESD schools when they reside in the TESD at time of enrollment as determined by law. In this regard and by way of examples, the following do not establish residency:

1. ~~Current Ownership~~ or proof of future ownership of property (regardless of whether the property is residential, commercial or industrial) in the TESD without actual residency in the TESD at time of enrollment.
2. Residency with another family without complying with requirements established elsewhere in this Policy.
3. Residency with a parent who has less than 50% custody, without a court order specifically designating the TESD as the District of residence for school attendance purposes.

The TESD will only permit the enrollment of nonresident students when they are eligible for a specific reason as set forth in this Policy or as required by law. ~~Enrollment shall be denied in any instance where the educational facility or program maintained for the resident children of the TESD is inadequate to meet the needs of the nonresident student as determined by the Superintendent of Schools.~~

While the TESD's practice is not to enroll nonresident students on a tuition basis, nothing in this Policy shall preclude the TESD from assessing tuition charges to families whose children attend school in violation of this Policy and its accompanying regulation.

Determining Eligibility

All requests for a nonresident student to enroll in the schools of the TESD shall be made in writing and reviewed by the Superintendent's designee prior to registration in any school. Nonresident students are approved for enrollment in the TESD without tuition charge under the conditions listed below.

1. Students living with a TESD resident by court order or otherwise in accordance with Section 1305 of the Pennsylvania School Code.
2. Students living with a TESD resident in accordance with Section 1302 of the Pennsylvania School Code. Compliance with Section 1302 must be confirmed by affidavit prior to school enrollment.
3. ~~Through and only through the conclusion of the 2016-17 school year, a~~ Conestoga High School student who has attended Conestoga for their entire sophomore and junior years and attained eligibility for senior status, but whose family moves from the TESD after the last student day of the student's junior year shall be allowed to

enroll as a senior, provided the enrollment is continuous and uninterrupted. This entitlement shall apply only to the school year following the student's junior year at Conestoga and shall not extend beyond the last regular student day of school for the Spring Term of the school year following the junior year, unless otherwise required by the student's Individualized Education Program. Transportation for students under this subsection shall be the responsibility of the student's parent or guardian. The TESD reserves the right (subject to required expulsion procedures) to remove a student covered by this subsection if, in the judgment of the administration, that student's conduct or scholastic record (or parents' conduct in relation to the student) is such that a disproportionate amount of staff time is required. ~~After the conclusion of the 2016-17 school year, no student may attend Conestoga High School pursuant to this paragraph.~~

3. Consequences of Attendance in Violation of Policy

Any nonresident student found to be attending TESD schools without qualifying under this Policy and without advance permission will be disenrolled immediately according to law and charged tuition for the days attended.

Nothing in this Policy is intended to waive the TESD's right to collect tuition from individuals and entities other than the student or student's parent or guardian where permitted by law.

Definitions

~~“Simulated medication” or “look-alike drugs” are defined as substances from ordinary daily use that may be used to feign or mimic the appearance, actual use or effects of substances that alter behavior or judgment.~~

~~“Illegal and other controlled substances” are defined as any substance defined as any controlled substance classified as illegal under the Pennsylvania law or federal law.~~

“Prohibited items” means, for purposes of this Policy:

(1) illegal and other controlled substances, medication, as defined in other policies governing medication, or any other substance which alters behavior or judgment; or

(2) simulated medication or “look-alike drugs (defined below)” by a student or students;

(3) anabolic steroids, except for a valid medical purpose as prescribed by a licensed healthcare provider; and Human Growth Hormone (HGH) is not included as an anabolic steroid. Body building, muscle enhancement, increasing muscle bulk or strength, or the enhancement of athletic ability are not valid medical purposes;

(4) alcoholic beverages; or

(5) paraphernalia associated with (1), (2) or (3).

The term “prohibited items” does not include medication currently prescribed for a student by a licensed healthcare provider according to that student’s medically diagnosed needs, provided that the use of medication is by the student only pursuant to the prescription and otherwise in accordance with other District policies governing the use of medication.

“Simulated medication” or “look-alike drugs” are defined as substances use that may be used to feign or mimic the appearance, actual use or effects of substances that alter behavior or judgment.

“Under the influence” means noticeable impairment of ability to ambulate, converse, comprehend or perform motor tasks as a result of consumption of prohibited items.

Prohibited Conduct

Detected evidence of use of, distribution of, or possession of, or being under the influence of prohibited items (1) illegal and other controlled substances, medication, as defined in other policies governing medication or any other substance which alters behavior or judgment; or (2) simulated medication or “look-alike drugs” by a student or

~~students~~ within any of the buildings owned by the District, on school grounds, in school vehicles and/or while participating in school-sponsored activities on or off District premises shall cause the student or students to be placed on immediate suspension and delivered into the custody of their parents or legal guardian. Aiding or abetting any of the above shall be treated in the same manner. The proper law enforcement authorities will be notified of such action. Expulsion proceedings may be initiated as warranted.

~~This Policy does not apply to the use of medication currently prescribed for a student by a licensed healthcare provider according to that student's medically diagnosed needs provided that the use of medication is in accordance with other District policies governing the use of medication.~~

~~The use of anabolic steroids by any student, except for a valid medical purpose as prescribed by a licensed healthcare provider constitutes prohibited conduct as defined above. Body building, muscle enhancement, increasing muscle bulk or strength, or the enhancement of athletic ability are not valid medical purposes. The Superintendent shall promulgate regulations imposing penalties for use of steroids in accordance with 35 P.S. §807.3. Human Growth Hormone (HGH) is not included as an anabolic steroid under this Policy.~~

Response of School District Personnel

It shall be the duty of all personnel, upon observance of the possession of ~~illegal drugs, alcohol, or any other mind-altering substance or simulated medication~~ prohibited items or behavior associated with or evidence of ~~substance abuse~~ use of prohibited items on the part of a student or students while on District property, or engaged in school-related activities, to immediately report such observed behavior to the appropriate medical or supervisory personnel.

Upon reasonable suspicion that a student is concealing evidence of ~~substances subject to this Policy~~ prohibited items, the administration may search the person, personal effects, lockers and automobiles of students, consistent with applicable statutes and case law and in accordance with Regulation 5405.

Prevention

The principal, together with school staff and parents and guardians, shall ~~develop a plan designed to collaborate~~ to prevent future ~~substance abuse~~ student use of prohibited items by a student violating this Policy.

Self-Harming Behavior

Although the District is not legally responsible for student self-harming behavior, all efforts will be made to ensure the safety of students.

“Self-harming behavior” includes but is not limited to threats of suicide, excessive risk taking, purposeful self-injury, and evidence of excessive alcohol consumption or harmful drug use.

Suicide Prevention

The Board recognizes its responsibility to provide education on youth suicide awareness and prevention, and to establish methods of suicide prevention, intervention and response.

Therefore the Board directs the Superintendent to develop guidelines and procedures, in compliance with state law and regulations, utilizing a multifaceted approach to suicide prevention which integrates school and community-based supports.

Other Self-harming Behavior

It is the policy of the District to take all signs of self-harming behavior seriously. Once evidence of self-harming behavior is made known to a District employee, the employee must intervene and immediately in accordance with the procedures outlined in the accompanying Administrative Regulation 8XXX5423. ~~bring the concern to one or more of the following:~~

- ~~1. school counselor,~~
- ~~2. school nurse,~~
- ~~3. school based mental health specialist, or~~
- ~~4. building administrator.~~

~~A building administrator shall immediately refer the concern to a school counselor, school nurse, or school based mental health specialist. The school counselor, school nurse or other District mental health specialist shall follow the procedures set forth in Administrative Regulation which shall include procedures for contacting parents and guardians.~~

~~If there is any indication that the child is in imminent danger, the child shall not be left alone. The reporting person shall remain with the child until a school counselor, school nurse, school based mental health specialist, or building administrator arrives.~~

~~The District curriculum and related instructional program are dedicated to differentiated teaching with a strong emphasis on diagnosing the learning needs and achievement of each student.~~

~~The actual average student:teacher ratio and actual e~~Class sizes may be expected to vary from the stated target ratio, within a range, depending on enrollments, instructional considerations, administrative constraints, and economic impact.

~~Ranges-~~The Upper Target for each ~~target ratio-class size~~ shall serve as a guideline in allocating staff prior to the start of the school year. Although exceptions below or above these ranges may occur due to specific circumstances, the administration will generally allot staff based on the following as follows for the 1998-99 school year and beyond:

The nature of the instructional program and the organizational patterns of the District provide for various types of flexible grouping which are possible under the above ~~student:teacher ratio~~ Upper Target designations. Therefore, the size of the instructional groups will vary according to the need and purpose of specific learning activities.

Flexibility in group size is a major factor in the elementary and middle school team teaching organization. Assigning students to various sized groups (small groups of 5 or 10 students, average size groups of 25 students and large groups of 50 or more students) according to the purpose of the instruction and the needs of the students is essential to conducting meaningful instruction within the framework of the team program.

Regrouping of students by achievement level occasionally creates specific classes which may ~~fall above or below class size ranges~~ exceed the Upper Target designations. This may also occur as a result of team scheduling at the middle school or to provide for the inclusion of students with disabilities who are eligible for specially designed instruction in regular classes.

The administration will identify these classes and recommend support or staffing as may be needed to provide for the instructional needs of the students on a case-by-case basis so that the appropriate placement of students is not compromised.

In grades K-6, the Upper Target shall be used as a staffing guideline for language arts classes. In grades 7-12, the Upper Target shall be used as a staffing guideline for all core academic subjects. Variations above and below the Upper Target are permitted based on student academic needs, budgeted staffing allocations, facilities limitations, and the number of student course requests for specific courses.

This Policy does not apply to non-core academic subjects.

APPENDIX A

ADMINISTRATOR PERFORMANCE REVIEW PROCESS

PHILOSOPHY

Evaluation is a process whereby the effectiveness of the educational administrator is appraised in relationship to established goals and objectives, the members' own personal competencies, and the ability of the individual to carry out established, administrative practices and procedures. The aim of such an evaluation process is toward encouraging personal growth and attaining the highest personal performance in support of the overall mission of the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District.

PURPOSES

1. The evaluation should effectively link basic job requirements/responsibilities, and district targets and/or targets established by the individual administrator in collaboration with his/her supervisor.
2. The evaluation should be used to promote and assist in professional growth.
3. The evaluation should be used to fulfill, in a uniform manner, the legal requirement of state and local authorities.
4. The evaluation should be used to determine the quality of administrative performance in order to provide merit pay incentive increments.

EVALUATION REVIEW PROCESS:

The following appraisal system will be in effect until such time as state legislation requires a change to the process.

Principals and Assistant Principals

As required by Act 82, the evaluation system for principals and assistants will include an assessment of practice as measured by the Framework for Leadership for Principals/School Leaders. In addition, the evaluation will include a set of multiple measures of student achievement that include building and correlation data, as well as elective data such as principal designed student learning objectives.

Supervisors will use The Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) approved rating form to complete evaluations will be used. In addition to observations of practice, as part of the evaluation process principals and assistants may submit to their supervisors evidence in support of their professional practice. Examples of evidence could include among other things self-evaluations, communication logs to parents, staff, students and/or community, or agendas and minutes from meetings.

The supervisor will complete the rating form in a timely fashion as soon as all necessary data has been received from the principal or assistant and PDE.

Supervisors and Directors

The same evaluation procedures used for principals and assistants shall apply to supervisors and directors with the following modifications.

1. The Framework for Leadership for Directors/Supervisors shall be used for assessment of practice.
2. The evaluation will include only assessment of practice and district student performance data.
3. The PDE approved “Nonteaching Professional Employee Rating Form” shall be used for the evaluation.

Evaluation Review Procedure

It is possible that an administrator may not agree with the performance evaluation given by his/her immediate supervisor. In this event, the administrator may explain, in writing, the area(s) of concern or disagreement, and have it attached to the rating form. This should be done within one week following the evaluation meeting. All attachments are to be signed and dated by the administrator submitting the attachments and signed by the immediate supervisor. Copies of said attachments, along with the rating form, will be made part of the administrator’s personnel file/record.
