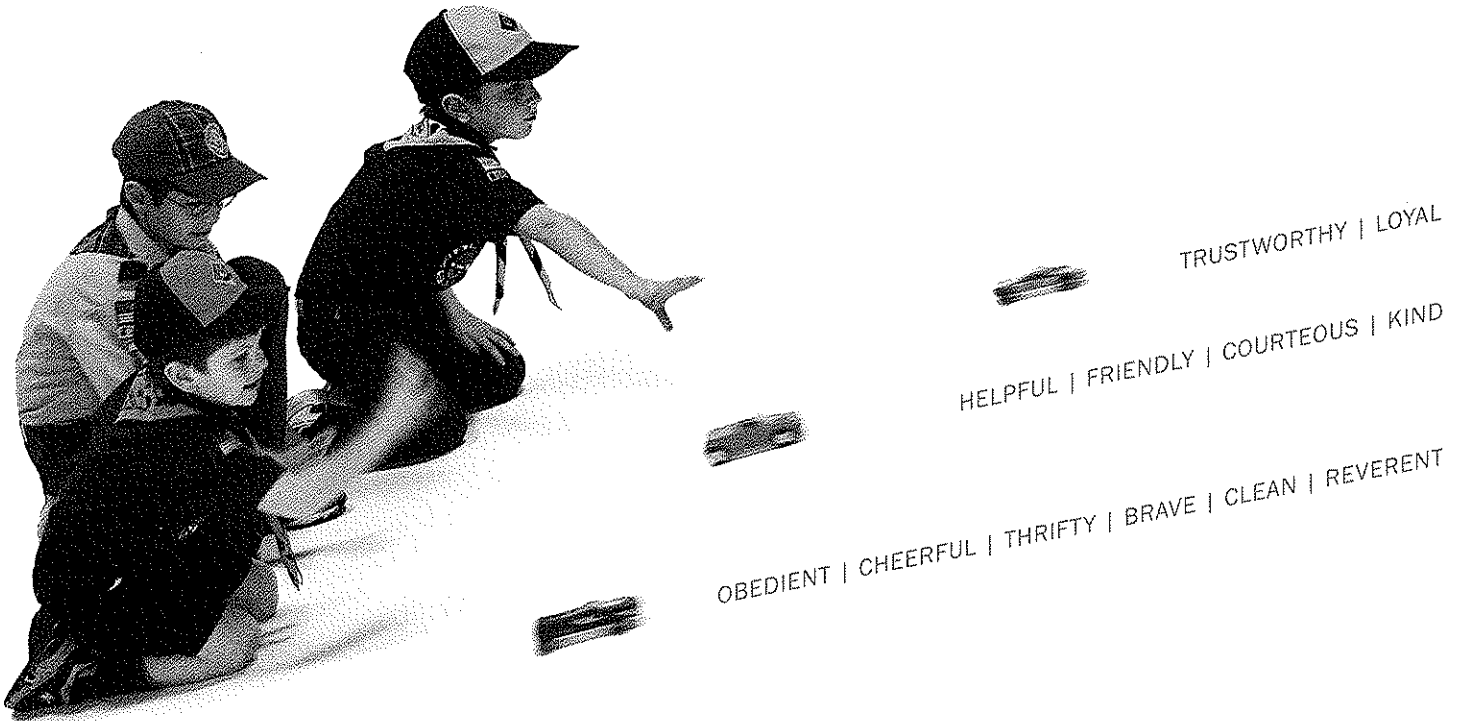

Why Cub Scouting?

Cub Scouting's strength is that it is a well-rounded program, positively affecting every area of a boy's life.

Cub Scouting encourages boys to achieve a deeper appreciation of others, including peers, parents, and other adults. Early in their Scouting experience, boys learn the value of serving others.

Cub Scouting provides boys with a sense that they are important as individuals. They learn that their Scouting family cares about what happens to them.

Cub Scouting promotes activities that lead to personal responsibility and build self-esteem.

Cub Scouting teaches your son....

- Confidence through recognition by adults.
- Belonging by building relationships with other boys.
- Quality family time to strengthen the bond between parent and child.
- Social skills through interacting with other boys and adults.
- Moral and ethical choices by instilling essential values.
- Citizenship by working in a team with other Scouts and doing service projects.

What do I do as a parent?

Cub Scouting is a program that parents and sons can do together. Parents who volunteer spend about three hours per week involved in Cub Scouting activities. This includes meeting with the boys and planning time. As a parent volunteer, there are a variety of positions to fill, such as den leaders, committee members, Cubmaster and committee chairman. Volunteering helps strengthen the bond between parent and child. Training is provided.

How Cub Scouting works....

Cub Scouting is for boys in the 1st through 5th grades. Your boy is a member of a den. A den consists of four to eight boys who meet according to their schedules. A den leader (usually a parent) is in charge of the activities, which include games, crafts, songs, ceremonies and lots of fun!

Your boy is a member of a pack. The pack consists of several dens and meets once per month. The Cubmaster leads pack meetings with Scouts and their families in attendance. The pack meeting is made up of fun activities, as well as the presentation of awards that have been earned during the month.

A registration fee will be collected at sign up time! Your pack leaders will determine the amount of registration fee collected. Please "Be Prepared".

A note to parents: Scouting is a volunteer organization, which relies solely on family/parent participation and leadership. Adult partners who do not volunteer for pack or den leader positions will be asked to participate in meetings and activities, help approve advancements, attend monthly pack meetings, and assist leaders when needed. Please attend the location of your choice to sign up for Scouting.
