Tredyffrin/Easttown School District 2014-2015 School Year Highlights

T/E students consistently perform among the top two percent of all public schools on the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment, which is administered in reading, math and writing in grades three through eight and in science in grades four and eight. The average scaled scores for T/E students were among the very highest in the State.

T/E students at all levels demonstrated outstanding performance in numerous science & math competitions throughout the school year including Conestoga High School students qualifying for prestigious USA Mathematical and Physics Olympiad Exams placing these students in the top 1% of students in the country; perfect scores in the American Mathematics Competition; second team placement in the middle school Mathcounts State Competition; and innovative entries in local science fair competitions.

The Conestoga Class of 2015 was a leader in Pennsylvania with forty-four National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists, thirty-nine National Merit Commended Students, a National Achievement Scholarship Semifinalist, a National Hispanic Scholar and a National Achievement Outstanding Participant.

A research-based program to promote a positive school climate is in place at the elementary and middle schools as the foundation of a safe learning environment. At the high school level, peer mediators support fellow students through conflict resolution, anger management, tolerance and school-wide unity events in the Conestoga community.

Conestoga High School's teams placed first, second and third in the Pennsylvania Economics Challenge.

In 2014, Conestoga High School students completed 1,670 Advanced Placement tests. The average score was 4.13 on a 5 point scale.

T/E School District middle school and high school student athletes have been recognized for exhibiting outstanding sportsmanship and for capturing numerous regional titles.

Six Conestoga High School students were selected for State Orchestra and Choir. These students advanced to the state competition after successfully qualifying for district then regional competitions.

The District's comprehensive digital citizenship program has been expanded to begin in first grade. Through eighth grade, students participate in a digital citizenship curriculum to learn about internet safety; cyberbullying; privacy and security; self-image and identity; relationships and communication; social network responsibility and the future effects of a personal "digital footprint."

Conestoga High School ranked high among high schools nationally in numerous commercial publications including U.S. News and World Report, Newsweek, The Washington Post and Niche.com.

Conestoga High School students consistently scored well above state and national averages on the 2014 Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) which is a standardized college entrance exam. With mean scores of 598 in reading, 607 in math and 590 in writing, Conestoga students ranked second in Pennsylvania on SAT scores. 95% of Conestoga seniors go on to attend a four-year college.
