December 2021 - Team Updates

#### Kindergarten:

What an exciting month in the kindergarten classrooms! Gingerbread men and snowmen were the creative focus this month. We read many versions of the Gingerbread man story and compared story elements. We practiced retelling the stories as well. Our hallway is alive with some very creative Gingerbread people.

In Science, the students finished the unit on agriculture and learned about different animal coverings such as scales, feathers, and fur. The students practiced identifying different animal coverings by using their sense of touch and sight to feel fur, scales, feathers, shells, and then to guess what animal it may have come from.

In Social Studies the students listened to the Christmas, Hanukkah, and Kwanzaa books from the Holiday curriculum.

Our kindergarten mathematicians learned about measurement and the concepts of more, less, and the same. They used several nonstandard units such as unifix cubes, paperclips, and popsicle sticks to measure objects.

We had fun playing coding games in celebration of the Hour of Code. This global movement strives to bring awareness to and interest in computer science.

We ended the month with our winter party! The children had fun making snowmen, playing games, and listening to a story.

### First Grade:

# Third Grade:

December was a month full of fun activities for VFE third graders!

The students were very excited to participate in the "Hour of Code" this month. Students were able to select activities from a variety of websites and apps on the iPads to explore the concept of writing code. This was a highly enjoyable activity for all students!

Many third grade students participated in the Winter Concert which featured our orchestra and chorus students. Ms. Poll and Mrs. Mertz did a wonderful job leading our musical groups!

This month in Reading, we focused on identifying theme, author's point of view, and reviewing main idea. We also continue to practice looking back in the text to answer comprehension questions and formulate written responses to the text that include restating the question, citing text evidence, and summarizing our answer. In Writing, we completed our expository writing piece and took some time to work on writing some poetry, specifically limericks.



In Social Studies, we are continuing our study of the Indigenous People of North America and how they use their natural local resources to provide for all their basic needs. Each 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class has started to learn about a specific tribe as well that they will share about in January.

In Science, our students continued their study of land and water through experiments and data collecting.

In all Math classes, students have been busy solving word problems. We are asking the students to read the problems carefully and look for key words to help them decide which operation is needed to solve the problem. Using bar models to represent their thinking is a great way to conceptualize their problem solving. Some classes have also been working on multiplication while others are working on improper fractions.

We finished up the month with class parties and winter activities! We are extremely proud of the hard work our students are putting forth this year and look forward to a great 2022 with these awesome third graders!

### Fourth Grade:



It was a December to remember for us! Fourth graders were so excited to participate in The Hour of Code that took place this month. Each class took time to let the kids explore various coding apps and websites.

We finished Unit 2 of Wonders. In unit 2, students studied poetry. We read many poems about animals and discussed how poets are inspired by these unique animals. We studied how poets use figurative language in their poems to help readers create images in their mind. Students wrote their own poems about animals using what they

learned. In the new year, we will begin Unit 3 of wonders and continue to study different types of genres in both reading and writing.

In social studies, we are learning all about the causes of the American Revolution. After this, we will be learning all about the battles that took place as part of the American Revolution.

In science, students have been studying electricity. They learned about the different types of lightbulbs and discussed which lightbulbs are best for them to use at home.

#### Music:

What a wonderful few months it has been in music! Students from all grade levels have been studying about music from around the world as well as learning about new instruments.
