What is the CARE Team?

Who We Are...

The CARE
Team is part
of a statewide Student Assistance Program. There



are SAP teams in operation in all of Pennsylvania's middle schools.

Our Mission Statement...

The VFMS CARE Team is a certified group of teachers, administrators, school & community counselors who are trained to help remove the barriers that impede a student's academic success.

Barriers may include: self-esteem, family problems, appearing sad, use of alcohol, tobacco, and/or other drugs, issues with eating, problems with peers, etc. CARE Team members do not diagnose, treat, or refer students for treatment, but they may refer a student for a parent approved assessment.

All information collected through the SAP process is confidential

How the Referral Process Works:

- ⇒ Student is referred to CARE Team. (Referral forms are located in the guidance office, nurse's office and library).
- ⇒ Once referral is received, a case manager is assigned. The case manager distributes a checklist to all of the student's teachers. The checklist focuses only on observable behaviors only.
- ⇒ The student's parents are contacted by the case manager when the checklist is distributed.
- ⇒ Once the data is collected, the team reviews the information.

One or more of the following may occur:

- The information may indicate that no action is needed.
- The parent may pursue private counseling or medical attention.
- With parental consent, the student may be recommended to meet with the mental health or drug/alcohol counselor for an assessment.
- The team may conduct a formal or informal intervention.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT:

The CARE Team recognizes that you as a parent have a major role and responsibility in making decisions regarding your child. The team will make every effort to involve parents in every step of the process.

WARNING SIGNS:

- Dramatic attention-getting behavior
- Drop in grades
- Changing group of friends
- Loss of interest/eligibility in sports
- Appears sad
- Puffiness around eyes
- Bloodshot eyes that appear glassy
- Change in sleeping/eating habits
