Online Learning Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. What courses will be offered?
 - Conestoga High School will maintain an active list of distance E-Learning courses that are available for online learning.
 - Eligible courses will be reviewed by curriculum supervisors on an ongoing basis.
- 2. Can students request a specific course to be added to the list of available courses?
 - Yes, but to be included, each request must pass a curriculum review.
- 3. Will distance E-Learning courses be offered that are the same as regular courses at Conestoga?
 - Courses that are deemed by the District as substantively similar to current face-to face classes will not be offered as Distance E-Learning courses.
- 4. May students take online *college* courses as part of this initiative?
 - Students may only take online high school courses approved by the District.
- 5. What is the length of a distance E-Learning course? A semester or a year?
 - This will depend on the specific online course. The length of some online courses will be a semester and the length of others will be a full year.
- 6. Who issues the course grades?
 - The online provider issues the course grades. Teachers and administrators at Conestoga are not involved with the grading process for distance E-Learning courses.
- 7. Will distance E-Learning grades appear on Conestoga's report cards?
 - No
- 8. Will distance E-Learning grades be used in GPA calculations or for honor roll eligibility?
 - No
- 9. Will distance E-Learning grades be included on transcripts?
 - Credits earned for online courses will be listed on the Conestoga transcript under a separate heading.
 - Numerical grades and course names for online courses will not be listed on the transcript.
 - Online courses will carry a "P" grade designation on the transcript, indicating that the course was successfully passed.
 - The grade report from the vendor listing the specific course name and achievement level may be attached to the Conestoga transcript upon request.
- 10. How will credits be applied to graduation requirements?
 - Online credit applies toward Electives and does not replace required department credits for graduation. Distance E-Learning courses may be offered to students to meet graduation requirements when extreme individual or family circumstances warrant special consideration as determined by the District.

- 11. How many courses per year are allowed?
 - A maximum of one (1) Conestoga credit may be earned each year for completing an online course.
- 12. Who pays for these courses?
 - The Tredyffrin/Easttown School District will cover tuition costs for pre-approved online courses.
 - Specific costs associated with the course would be a family responsibility.
- 13. When will students complete the work for online courses?
 - Students may complete work for online courses during their free time during the school day and at home
- 14. Are students required to complete all of the work that is assigned for the online course?
 - Yes
- 15. Will online courses count toward the 42 period per cycle maximum scheduling cap?
 - No
- 16. Are students required to have parental / guardian approval to take online courses?
 - Yes.
- 17. Can students take an online course with a partner or as part of a group of students?
 - No. Students must work independently to complete online course requirements.
- 18. Where can students go if they have questions about registration or need additional help with online coursework?
 - Students should address concerns with a counselor.
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
