

Student Activities

Each secondary school shall sponsor a reasonable number of student activities, such as student council, publications, music and dramatics groups. Such activities are intended to provide a service to the student body and to stimulate interest in worthwhile hobbies or avocations. These activities may vary from year to year, but it shall be the purpose of the school to maintain an optimal number of organizations--of sufficient diversity--to meet the needs of the student body.

School activities shall be organized when there is sufficient interest to warrant the activity and when sponsorship is available. When interest wanes, the administration shall investigate the reasons and determine whether the activity should be abandoned.

A system of awards for participation in service organizations of the school is encouraged. These awards should be certificates or letters, comparable to awards given in athletics. Additionally, small metal insignia are approved for this purpose. The principal of each school may request a reasonable budget allotment for the purchase of such certificate and insignia.

Cooperation in Providing Program

In providing a basic educational and recreational program for children of school age, Tredyffrin/Easttown School District wishes to cooperate with other agencies (e.g., Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Little League, YMCA, etc.) operating in the area served by the school systems to provide services beyond the basic program.
