

READING PROGRAM SELECTION COMMITTEE

Time Frame: The process of selecting the new program was started and completed over a span of two years.

Goal: The goal of the committee was to ensure that the new reading program would address the diverse learning needs of T/E students.

Committee members were comprised of Administrators, Teachers, Learning Support Instructors, and Reading Specialists from each school across grades K-4.



SELECTION AND IMPLEMENTATION

GRADES 3-4 PROGRAM SELECTION PROCESS

- After Wonders had been purchased for K-2, the Program Selection Committee reconvened to assess the Wonders implementation in K-2 and determine if Wonders should be the program purchased for Grades 3-4.
- Teachers, Reading Specialists, and Administrators spoke about the program analyzing its use through data and experience, and agreed that it would be the best choice for grades 3-4.

WONDERS PREPARATION

- In preparation for the program, teachers in grades 3-4 received virtual Wonders training and participated in a virtual LETRS workshop provided by the CCIU on April 14th and May 18th, 2021.
- Summer workshop sessions pertaining to Wonders were offered for teachers in grades K-4.
 - K-2 teachers discussed areas of need in the digital implementation of the program, explored new ideas, and grew a deeper understanding of the program's resources.
 - 3-4 teachers asked questions, learned more about the digital resources, and developed plans for the first unit.

CURRENT SUPPORTS AND TRAINING

- Grades 3-4 teachers have received LETRS training in a module related to Reading Comprehension; the training sessions began in February and will conclude in May.
- A pacing guide was created for (and with) teachers in K-4 to provide support for helping them to navigate through the Wonders instructional activities.
- Teachers have access to a Schoology page which was designed to serve as a repository for useful resources.
- Teachers have also utilized the support of the reading specialist who has worked heavily with Wonders since its inception.


LETRS AND WONDERS TRAINING

- Grades 3-4 participated in Wonders Training on April 14th and May 18th 2021.
- Summer workshop sessions pertaining to Wonders were offered for teachers in grades K-4.
- Ongoing training and professional development is available for teachers throughout the year and during numerous inservice sessions.
- LETRS training for teachers in grades 3-4 is on-going.


BENCHMARKS

• In the fall of 2021, we reviewed the results of the fall benchmarks as they related to ORF from Winter 20-21 to fall 21-22.

 We analyzed the data to gain a sense of how students were progressing, but were careful in terms of comparing the data in light of COVID-19

OBSERVATION, ANALYSIS, & FUTURE ACTIONS

Grade I Spring (20-21)/Grade 2 Fall (21-22) ORF results were below the recommended 80%-85% of students at or above benchmark.

Analysis

Grade I students contended with numerous changes to the instructional format in a foundational year when the leap in learning expectations from Kindergarten to first grade is substantial.

Additional experience and professional development for K-2 teachers using the Wonders program, focused data analysis and reading support for current grade 2 students, continued training sessions for grades 3-4 teachers correlating to Wonders and LETRS, and opportunities for intergrade discourse to net positive results.

- Students in the Brandywine Virtual Academy (BVA) were invited to take part in benchmark testing for the fall and winter sessions.
- Results from winter and spring assessments will be collected and analyzed to provide insight into the current trends and future course of action.

- The 4 Sight benchmark assessment that T/E has used to denote reading comprehension for students in grades 3-4 has been discontinued by Success for All.
- As a result, T/E is currently researching an assessment that can be used to replace the 4 Sight assessment.

READING CAMP UPDATE

- In July 2020- Reading Camp was conducted virtually. The camp
 was offered to students in grades K-4 and featured small group
 virtual sessions with teachers. The camp included special areas
 videos that students had the option to access and use. Over
 300 students participated in the camp.
- In July 2021, in light of the continuing pandemic trends, the Reading Camp was offered to students in both virtual and inperson formats. In-person camp took place at Devon Elementary School, and between the in-person and virtual components, nearly 300 students participated.
