# Reasons for Implementation

- Elementary Level- Replacement for the 4 Sight Assessment, which is no longer available.
  - Reading specialists and classroom teachers need an assessment alongside the MAZE/ORF retell for identifying comprehension needs, due to the absence of the 4 Sight.
- Middle Level- Provides a continuum of understanding between elementary and middle school levels.

# Academic Screening Tools Chart

1. **Classification Accuracy (Fall, Winter, Spring)** = The main goal of classification accuracy is to understand how well scores on a screening assessment correctly identify students at risk versus those not at risk.
2. **Technical Standards** = Reliability, Validity, Sample Representativeness, Bias Analysis Conducted
3. **Usability Features** = Admin Format, Admin & Scoring Time, Scoring Format, Types of Decision Rules, Evidence Available for Multiple Decision Rules

# Why i-Ready?

## Pros

- Offers 3 different assessments:  
*Diagnostic, Standards Mastery, Growth Monitoring*
- PSSA predictor
- One easy to read report for each assessment
- Provides norm referenced and criterion referenced results
- Includes a family report and student report
- Reporting includes break down of early, mid, on, *and* above grade level descriptors
- Assessment Suite includes follow up lessons and a check for understanding
- Aligned to the Science of Reading
- Compatible with Power School and Ipads
- Criterion and Norm Referenced

## Cons

- Digital option only (this was true of most other digital assessments)
- Read aloud option for phonics and vocabulary sections only
- No timer visible to students (this may also be a pro depending on the student)

# Plan for Implementation- Elementary

## Half-Day Training Sessions:

Sept. 20 (Morning); November 8 (Inservice); March 17 (Inservice)

Most grades 3-4 students will use the following schedule:

- September 27-30 Writing Prompt
- ERB's Oct. 10-14; Make-up Oct. 17-21
- Wonders Benchmark Assessment: January 9-13
- Wonders Benchmark Assessment: May 17-19

Each elementary school will have one grade 3 and one grade 4 class that take both the Wonders and I-Ready assessments.

- September 27-30 Writing Prompt
- ERB's Oct. 10-14; Make-Up Oct. 17-21
- I Ready- November 2-3
- Wonders- January 9-13
- I Ready- March- 14-15
- Wonders- May 17-19
