Reasons for Implementation

- <u>Elementary Level-</u> Replacement for the 4 Sight Assessment, which is no longer available.
 - Reading specialists and classroom teachers need an assessment alongside the MAZE/ORF retell for identifying comprehension needs, due to the absence of the 4 Sight.
- <u>Middle Level-</u> Provides a continuum of understanding between elementary and middle school levels.

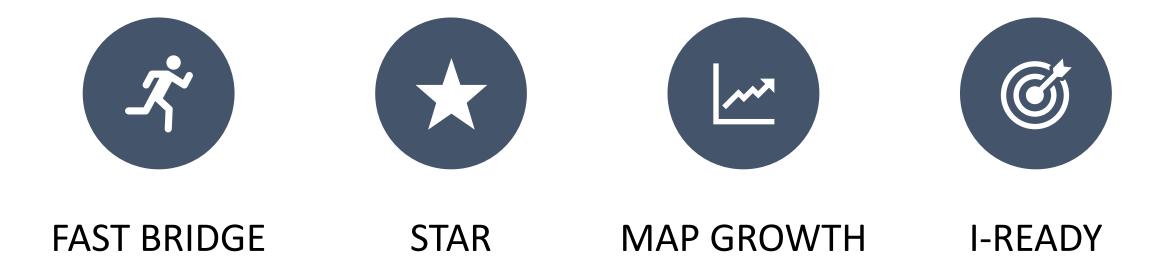
Academic Screening Tools Chart

- Classification Accuracy (Fall, Winter, Spring) = The main goal of classification accuracy is to understand how well scores on a screening assessment correctly identify students at risk versus those not at risk.
- Technical Standards = Reliability, Validity, Sample Representativeness, Bias Analysis Conducted
- Usability Features = Admin Format, Admin & Scoring Time, Scoring Format, Types of Decision Rules, Evidence Available for Multiple Decision Rules

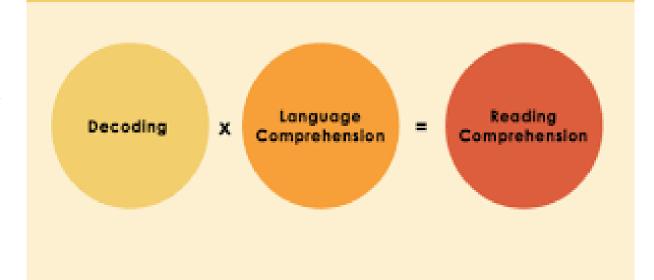
