Key Actions to Continue

- Follow mitigation efforts
 - Masking
 - Social Distancing
 - Symptom Screening
- Avoid carpooling
- Minimize close contacts with others outside of school.
- Keep your child home if they have symptoms.

Symptom Screener

Situations to date:

- A household member has tested positive Keep your child home
- A household member is awaiting a test result Keep your child home
- My child is congested (a symptom) but they have allergies Keep your child home and call your doctor
- My child has just one symptom Depending upon the symptom, you may wish to keep your child home while you contact your doctor for guidance
- My child is vaccinated, do I still do the symptom screener? Yes

Symptom Screener

Questions (Updated 4/06/2021)

- Does this student have any of the following symptoms:
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath
 - Difficulty breathing
 - Lack of smell or taste (without congestion)
- ☐ Does this student have two or more of the following symptoms:
 - Fever (Measured in the last two hours to be 99.5F or higher with contact-less forehead thermometer or armpit thermometer, or 100F or higher with oral thermometer)
 - Sore throat
 - Chills
 - Muscle pain
 - Fatigue
 - Headache
 - · Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea

Symptom Screener

☐ Has this student taken any medication to suppress a fever in the last 24 hours?
☐ Is this student/anyone in their household awaiting results from a COVID-19 test OR has this student/anyone in their household been determined to be a probable case/tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 14 days? If you answer yes to this question, please contact the school nurse to determine your eligibility to return to school.
☐ Has this student been in close contact in the past 14 days with a probable case/someone who has tested positive for COVID-19? If you answer yes to this question, please contact the school nurse to determine your eligibility to return to school.
☐ Has this student been told to self-isolate by a doctor or health department?

Quarantine vs. Isolation

Quarantine

While the Chester County Health Department continues to recommend a 14-day quarantine period for individuals who have had close contact with COVID-19 cases, the department also allows for the following alternative quarantine periods described below.

- Your quarantine can end after Day 10 without testing if you do not have any symptoms through the end of Day 10.*
- Your quarantine can end after Day 7 if you receive a negative diagnostic COVID-19 test (e.g. RTPCR, antigen) that was collected on Day 5 or thereafter, and you do not have any symptoms until the test result is received. If you test negative, you can resume in-person instruction and sports on the 8th day of your quarantine. *
- There are other factors that may impact quarantine such as previous Covid infection. The school nurse can assist.
- *Day 0 (zero) is the date of your most recent exposure to the COVID-19 positive or probable individual

Isolation

- If you test positive for COVID-19 or are a probable COVID-19 case (close contact to a COVID-19 case + have symptoms), you must isolate for 10 days after the date of your positive test or your first symptom.
- If you or a household member is awaiting a COVID-19 test result, the entire household must isolate, unless fully vaccinated and asymptomatic.
