Goal

 Increase in-person instructional opportunities while following health and safety recommendations and risk mitigation strategies supported by the Chester County Health Department and Pennsylvania Department of Health.

Overview of Re-Opening Plan

- We intend to have all schools open for increased inperson instruction beginning March 15, contingent on county level transmission rates
- A virtual option will be available to any family for the remainder of the school year
- Our instructional delivery model (teacher responsible for both the in-person students and virtual students on their roster, block schedule at the secondary level) will be in place for remainder of the school year
- Additional logistical details such as classroom setup, bus routes, lunch arrangements and arrival/dismissal procedures will be shared by schools and departments as information becomes available

Additional Details

- Begin with 4 in-person days, 1 virtual day each week
- Review and analyze the impact of removing the virtual day on all learners and staff
- Potential modifications to school day schedules to accommodate 5 in-person days beginning as soon as week of April 19

^{*}Physical distancing assumes school district is implementing COVID screening testing. Transient interactions of less than 3 feet, such as passing in the hallway, handing in papers to the teacher, etc. are unavoidable.

Health & Safety Plan Highlights



Continued Mitigation Strategies

- Face coverings required for everyone in the building
- Daily health screening
- Enhanced cleaning
- No visitors to school buildings

Additional Mitigation Strategies

- Enhanced face coverings protocol with appropriate fit (no gaiters)
- Vaccine advocacy
- Antigen testing
- Encouraging families to drive their child to school

Social distancing of 3-6 ft for students and 6 ft for staff will be observed to the greatest extent feasible

Spring Break and Rapid Antigen Testing

Travel is still discouraged

 Plan to offer rapid antigen test to all staff and families following Spring Break

Lunch

- Plan to maximize the amount of physical distance between students while eating
- Evaluating all options within school buildings to optimize physical distance
- Cannot guarantee six feet at all times

2021-2022

- Planning for 5 days of in-person instruction, unless there is a sharp worsening of pandemic conditions
- Analysis of whether to include virtual instruction and what it could look like will take place later this spring
