## Completed work to date

### Field Study

- Analyzed TESD on-site and off-site field usage
- Contacted all District 1 schools regarding their facilities and usage
- Presented findings to Facilities Committee (May)
- Committee recommended authorizing architects and engineers to perform site surveys and draft feasible layouts that would address field needs
- Presented findings to Facilities Committee (September). Further discussion recommended and community input

## Field Study Goals

- Maximize the number of athletic teams that can use onsite fields
- Reduce the need for busing student athletes to practices and competitions
- Minimize the number of practices later in the day
- Control over maintaining and preparing the playing fields
- Ensure adequate fields to meet needs of increased enrollment
- Reduce competitive disadvantage in turf sports
- Provide a comparable experience to athletes in similar schools
- Increase access to community groups

## **Field Study Assumptions**

- Demand for our playing fields will continue to increase due to rising enrollment, participation and all year usage
- Lights will not be added to existing or new fields reducing the amount of available playing time
- Elimination of busing saves student/coach time and reduces transportation costs
- The use of T/E Middle School athletic fields will be for Middle School use
- Where busing is required, team buses will be the preferred method of transport
- Teams will continue to utilize Township fields as allocated by the Township
- The District will continue to use two athletic trainers

## **Increased Sports Field Demand**

- Our enrollment is likely to gradually increase the participation in athletics
- To meet demand, we have added JVB programs which use community fields
- Other solutions to increased enrollment include developmental sports programs and intramurals
- Our current grass fields are multi-purpose and are used in the fall and spring
- One full-sized multi-purpose field has been lost due to CHS expansion project
- As demand and field usage increases, field conditions will deteriorate over time
- Turf wear and deterioration will be accelerated due to increased usage (common among "high use" facilities)
- One extra field will extend the life of all fields including turf
- ESC field could come offline if used as future school site

## TEMS/Conestoga Challenges

- Traffic around TEMS at the end of the day (in addition to wait time for buses) results in TEMS teams practicing approximately **40 minutes less PER DAY than VFMS teams** 
  - VFMS practice 3:22 PM to 5:00 PM,
  - TEMS practice 3:47 PM to 4:45 PM
  - Impact is a total of 20 hours less practice time per season for TEMS student athletes
- Conestoga also has delays reducing practice time due to changing and boarding buses
- Traffic congestion at Conestoga during dismissal creates gridlock at the same time athletic team buses are departing

### **Impact of Shared Fields**

- More evening practices
- Fewer full field practices
- More wear and tear on all fields
- Practices on fields not designed for the particular sport
- Scheduling difficulties
- Reduces opportunities for community use
- Impacts marching band

## **Competitive Disadvantage**

- Several athletic programs are practicing on a different surface than their competitions
- Practices also occur on fields that are not regulation size
- The sharing of fields inhibits full field practices
- The loss of practice time resulting from practicing off site
- We are trailing behind other districts when it comes to field accessibility

## Field Study Survey

42 PA High Schools were surveyed on the following:

- High School Enrollment
- Practice/competing off-site
- Number of Turf Fields
- Use by Community Groups
- Facility Rental Charges for Field Use

## Results of Field Study Survey

- High School enrollment range: 28 to 3900 students
- Practice or compete off-site: 36 Yes, 6 No
- # of Turf Fields
  - 13 SD's –1 Field
  - 11 SD's More than 1 Field
- Access to Community Groups: 39 Yes, 3 No
- Charge outside groups for field rentals: 38 Yes, 2 No, 2 DNR



# Advantages of adding two rectangular turf fields and one softball diamond

- Less travel for TEMS teams
- Less wear and tear on all fields
- Fewer night games and practices
- Less need to cancel games
- Pre-game practices on regulation turf fields
- More offsite TEMS games and practices at ESC instead of VFMS
- Would allow us to host TEMS/VFMS events
- Add in softball on campus

Teams that would still require travel to fields for practices and home games after addition of proposed fields

- CHS JV Baseball (D'Ambrosia)
- CHS 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Baseball (Wilson Farm Park)

Number of Students that would need to travel to participate in these Athletic Programs after the addition of new proposed fields: 138

This is a reduction of 63%

## Summary

The acquisition of the nursery property is a rare opportunity to

- Add to our field inventory
- Maximize the teams that can play and practice onsite
- Reduce the need and cost for busing
- Opportunity to improve traffic congestion on roads surrounding CHS and TEMS
- Minimize the number of evening events
- Increase access to community groups
- Additional revenue source from outside use

This could be achieved all within the contiguous property footprint of CHS
