We believe when students identify their purpose, they will do the work no matter how challenging to achieve their goals.


STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

01 COLLEGE AND CAREER ADVISING:


07 AUTHENTIC CAREER DISCOVERY:

Do I have to attend in person?

No, Project LEAP is completely virtual! Based on your timezone you will either be placed in Project LEAP East or Project LEAP West. Accepted students will also have the opportunity to participate in LEAP meets!

What is the official time commitment of Project LEAP?

The official time commitment is 4 hours per month however, most students participate in other workshops and virtual events throughout the month including student clubs and resume writing.

How often do we meet and when do we meet?

Project LEAP students meet one Saturday a month from 9am-12pm EST or 9am-12pm PST in the prospective time zones.

The schedule is below:

10th grade students: 2nd Saturday11th grade students: 3rd Saturday12th grade students: 1st Saturday

All meetings are held online via Zoom. Admitted students will receive a calendar with all scheduled dates. Meetings are held September-June.

Is there a GPA requirement? What if I'm right below the GPA requirement?

Yes! Freshmen must have at minimum, a 2.5 GPA from their first term or higher and sophomores and juniors must have a minimum 3.0 GPA or higher. If your GPA is above a 2.8, please apply anyway as we take a holistic approach to reviewing applications and this may not disqualify you from admission.

How long is the application? Do I have to write an essay?

There is no essay to submit with your application. We believe that it is best to meet students and listen as they talk about their passions, future goals, and overall life. In lieu of an essay, all applicants will participate in a 15 minute interview. The application should take no longer than 10 minutes to complete. In order to complete the application you will need an unofficial transcript.

Can I participate in Project LEAP even if I don't want to go to college?

Absolutely!

If I'm a current sophomore, can I still apply? What if I had academic struggles/struggles during the pandemic?

Yes! This is the last year that Project LEAP will accept current sophomores in addition to current freshmen. We completely understand, especially during the pandemic that students have faced multiple hardships related to financial struggles, mental health, and academic achievement. If you experienced anything of the sort, please feel free to share with us about it and the steps you are currently taking to overcome hardship.
