We seek to award scholarships to candidates who are performing well academically and who demonstrate character in their life.

This year, the Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 436 is sponsoring completion for two scholarships: The VVA436 Scholarship for \$3,000 and the Elizabeth and Peter Fifer Scholarship for \$3,000, for students who will attend college or technical school in the fall of 2024.

The applicant must submit an original essay (no less than 500 words) on the following topic:

Should the United States Government have mandatory military or voluntary military or public service such as the Peace Corps?

Requirements:

1. Applications are open to all senior students but extra consideration will be made for U.S. Military Veterans, ROTC, and/or veteran-relative. Those eligible candidates who wish to apply must be accepted or registered at an accredited college or technical school for the '24/'25 year.
2. Applicants must be legal residents of Chester County, PA. Applicants who are applying on the basis of a veteran-relative must include a copy of that veterans DD214 document. ROTC must provide documentation to show eligibility.
3. Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 436 Board of Directors shall evaluate and award the scholarship and will not be subject to appeal.
4. Awardees are required to use scholarship funds toward education or forfeit award. The awardee shall be responsible for contacting a tax consultant for rules governing the acceptance and use of scholarship funds.
