Community and High School

Located 15 miles west of Philadelphia in eastern Chester County, Tredyffrin and Easttown Townships form a suburban school district whose residents primarily engage in professional and business occupations.

Conestoga High School is a four-year public school that emphasizes college preparation. The current enrollment is approximately 2,000 students. Conestoga is consistently among the top high schools in the state in academic excellence. Accredited by the Middle States Commission on Secondary Schools and certified by the Pennsylvania Department of Education, Conestoga was among the first five public high schools in Pennsylvania selected for academic excellence in the National Secondary School Recognition Program. Nearly 50% of all students participate on at least one interscholastic athletic team and 14% participate in the intramural program. Over 88% are involved in at least one facet of a broad-based student activities program, which is notably strong in service and leadership, media production and publications, government and politics, and visual and performing arts.

Curriculum

An outstanding feature of Conestoga is its academic program. Students must earn 24 credits to meet graduation requirements. An individual program is developed for each student, and courses are offered at varying levels of difficulty. Most students take at least one honors level course. For the graduating class of 2009, 53.4% of students scored a 3 or higher on an AP test at some point in their high school years. Of the 1,164 AP examinations taken by Conestoga students in 2009, 46% achieved an AP score of 5, 32% achieved a score of 4, and 17% achieved a score of 3. All of the syllabi for the AP courses have been audited and approved by The College Board.


Independent study, self-directed learning and other enrichment opportunities are available in all disciplines. Qualifying seniors participate in a four-week internship program in May and June. Students may also enroll in specialized programs at the Center for Arts and Technology, which offers vocational and technical training.

College Placement

About 95% of 2009 Conestoga graduates chose to attend college after high school, with 97% attending four-year colleges. More than 51% selected private institutions, with 55% attending colleges and universities outside Pennsylvania. Many graduates enroll in institutions rated as "Most Selective" or "Highly Competitive" in college guides and publications (see back page for details).

National Merit/College Board Recognition

The Conestoga Class of 2010 includes 37 National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists, 31 National Merit Commended Students, 1 National Achievement Scholar, and 2 National Hispanic Scholars.

Advanced Placement Program

In May 2009, 606 Conestoga students, or 31% of the student body, completed 1164 College Board Advanced Placement (AP) examinations. A score of 3 or higher was earned on 95% of the tests. AP courses offered at Conestoga are listed under Curriculum. This school year, the College Board will recognize 235 of these students as a *Scholar*, *Scholar with Honor*, *Scholar with Distinction*, *State Scholar*, and/or National Scholar.

Pennsylvania System of School Assessment

Conestoga students consistently perform well on the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA), which is administered in Reading, Mathematics, Writing and Science to every eleventh grader in public schools throughout the state. The average scaled scores for Conestoga students were among the very highest in the state in 2009.

Instructional Levels

Students are homogeneously grouped in all academic departments: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, and World Languages. Levels are designated on the transcript as follows:

Students are heterogeneously grouped in nonacademic departments, except where Advanced Placement courses are offered.

Grade Point Average (GPA)

The GPA includes only leveled courses valued at 0.5 credits or more. Weighted to reflect levels of instruction, GPA is cumulative and gives no advantage to the student with a heavier course load. Only those courses taken at Conestoga High School are included in the GPA.

Weighted GPA

Using an indexed GPA scale with a maximum cumulative GPA value approaching 5.3, the highest GPA for the class of 2010 was 5.19 at the end of the junior year. The GPA is cumulative for grades 9, 10, and 11, and by the conclusion of the junior year, 487 members of the Conestoga High School Class of 2009 had earned weighted grade point averages within the bands indicated below. The R (Reading), M (Math) and W(Writing) scores represent the mean of the students' best SAT Reasoning scores within each GPA band at the conclusion of the junior year.

Unweighted GPA

The Unweighted GPA is reported on the transcript along with the Weighted GPA. The Unweighted GPA is computed on a traditional 4.0 system in which grades are valued as follows: A's (90-100) 4.0, B's (80-89) 3.0, C's (70-79) 2.0 and D's (65-69) 1.0.

College Destinations for the Class of 2009

Members of the Conestoga High School Class of 2009 have matriculated at the colleges and universities listed below. In a typical year, more than 75% of Conestoga graduates attend colleges listed in the Best 368 Colleges, a publication of the Princeton Review. Institutions are listed alphabetically within ranges based on students' cumulative grade point averages (GPA's) at the conclusion of the junior year. Where more than one student from the GPA band enrolled, the number of students is indicated in parentheses. With grade point averages weighted to reflect course difficulty, the highest GPA for the Class of 2009 was 5.15. The R (Reading), M (Math) and W (Writing) scores represent the mean of the student's best SAT Reasoning Test scores within each GPA band.
