<u>SchoolMessenger Upgrade – Update</u>

• At the October 4, 2016 Public Information Committee meeting, District staff were asked whether it would be possible to send texts by school through the SchoolMessenger upgrade. The initial presentation at the meeting proposed a texting option that would allow parents and community members to opt-in through the District website to receive text notifications of District-level emergency closing announcements. As a follow-up to the question about school-specific texting, the District contacted SchoolMessenger with additional questions. The District learned that it would be able to do school-specific texting by using the TE All-Call student database, but it would be a different process than the self-subscribing option that was discussed at the last Public Information Committee meeting. District staff reviewed the two options for sending emergency text messages and the Committee recommended that the District use the option that would limit text messaging to numbers included in the TE All-Call database. The upgraded contract with SchoolMessenger will be included on the October 24, 2016 Regular Board Meeting agenda.



- The District's current website was created in 2008.
- A new website template will remove the need for Adobe Flash Player, make the site easier to navigate on mobile devices and meet new accessibility requirements.
- Our goal is keep the site's content the same and in the same location, but with a new "overlay" to improve functionality and design.



Improvements with New Template

Removal of Adobe Flash Player

- The District's current website uses the multimedia platform Adobe Flash Player to display the rotating center photos on the District homepage and school homepages.
- Google Chrome has announced plans to discontinue the display of Flash content by default and will begin using HTML5 as an alternative to Flash.
- Analytics indicate that over 40% of our website visitors use Google Chrome to view the TESD website.






Improvements with New Template

Mobile Responsiveness


- On average, 35% of our visitors are using a mobile device when visiting the District website.
- While the TESD website is considered "mobilefriendly" because all of the content is still accessible from a mobile device, the website does not change or adapt to a mobile device.
- When accessed from a mobile device, the current TESD site displays a web app with the option to see the full site.

Mobile Responsiveness

- The new website templates offered by Schoolwires are mobile responsive.
- Mobile responsive websites adapt to the visitor's device to provide easy navigation with minimal resizing, panning and scrolling to view the content.

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


