Absences and Leaves Due to Illness, Injury and Disability

Whenever an employee is prevented by illness, injury or disability from performing customary duties, the District shall pay the employee <u>full current salary</u> for each <u>full or partial</u> day of absence, in accordance with lawto the extent required by law, as outlined in the accompanying regulations, and and by contractual agreements. Each employee shall notify the District when unable to report to work.

Special Provision for Employees Not Covered By Group or Individual Contracts

Sick Leave

For employees not covered by contract, sick leave will be accrued as indicated:

Full-time Employees

Ten-month Employees - Ten (10) days Twelve-month Employees - Twelve (12) days

Part-time Employees

For part-time employees, sick time will be computed as follows:

Ten-month Employees - Ten (10) days times the full-time equivalency of the part-time employee

Twelve-month Employees - Twelve (12) days times the full-time equivalency of the part-time employee

Unused Sick Leave

For employees governed by a collective bargaining agreement or a group or individual contract, unused sick leaves accumulate as set forth in the applicable agreement. For all other employees, uUnused Unused sick leave days isare not accumulated from year to year, absent an approved Board resolution to the contrary.

Provisions Applicable to All Employees

Limitations on Length of Leave

If the absence of an employee because of illness or injury exceeds the number of accumulated sick days available to that employee, then in such event, the return of an employee from such leave of absence after the exhaustion of accumulated sick days available to that employee shall be at the sole discretion of the Board, subject only to the limitations of any applicable law, including but not limited to the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA), the Family Medical Leave Act and the Pennsylvania Workers Compensation Act, and any applicable employment agreement. For purposes of leave

recommended pursuant to the ADA, the Board will apply the criteria set forth in the accompanying Administrative Regulation.

Long Term Disability

An eligible employee may, at his or her sole discretion, initiate an application for long term disability benefits after the appropriate waiting period.

Medical Certification

At any time during the course of any leave under this Policy, the Superintendent or designee may require the employee to furnish a certificate from a physician detailing the employee's physical or mental condition, as appropriate under the circumstances, or require such employee to undergo a medical examination by a physician(s) designated by the District. After such examination of the employee, if the physician designated by the District determines that the employee is physically fit to return to the same or substantially equivalent position, and that employee does not do so after written notice from the District to the employee to return on a certain day, then that employee shall be deemed to have forfeited all rights to employment with the District.

Misuse of Sick Leave

Misuse of leave shall be considered a serious infraction subject to disciplinary action consistent with any applicable collective bargaining agreement.

Electronic Communication Devices: Use by Students

Definition

"Electronic devices" means a privately owned wireless and/or portable electronic piece of equipment that could include laptops, netbooks, tablets/slates, smart phones, music and video players, digital cameras, wearable electronics and handheld game devices..

Definition

"Electronic Communication Devices" is defined in the accompanying regulation.

Restrictions on Use of Electronic Communication Devices

Except where the use of electronic <u>communication</u> devices has been prohibited by law, students may possess electronic <u>communication</u> devices as defined in the accompanying regulation, within all of the buildings owned by the District, on school grounds, in school vehicles and/or while participating in school-sponsored activities on or off school premises. The administration shall have the right to regulate the use and possession of all electronic <u>communication</u> devices. In addition to limitations on use and possession imposed by the school administration, possession of electronic <u>communication</u> devices is subject to the following restrictions:

- Students may not use electronic <u>communication</u> devices to conduct any activities which violate state and/or federal law, Board Policy, District Administrative Regulations, <u>District Acceptable Use Agreements</u> or school rules.
- 2. Students may not use electronic <u>communication</u> devices in any manner which interferes with, or is disruptive to, educational or extracurricular activities or events.
- 3. Students may not use electronic <u>communication</u> devices or have them readily accessible when they are in restrooms, locker rooms <u>and inor</u> other areas where individuals would have a similar expectation of privacy.

Notwithstanding the rules set forth above, electronic <u>communication</u> devices may be used:

- 1. at any time to respond to or report an emergency situation; and
- 2. when and as required pursuant to a student's Individualized Education Program or Section 504 Service Agreement.

Violations of this Policy may result in disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, suspension and/or expulsion.

Nonparticipation in Selected Specific Instruction and State Assessments

Upon receipt of <u>a</u> written requests from <u>a-the</u> parent or guardian <u>of -a student</u>, or the <u>student</u> themselves if they are an- <u>emancipated minor</u> (as defined in the accompanying regulation), the <u>student</u> shall be excused from specific instruction or required state assessments conflicting with their religious beliefs in accordance with applicable law as set forth in the accompanying regulation. For purposes of this Ppolicy, —locally approved and administered assessments established pursuant to state law regarding state assessments are to be treated as state assessments.

Action Under Consideration: That the Board of School Directors approves the attached Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District and the Tredyffrin/Easttown Education Association. This MOU designates August 24, 2016 as the earliest first day for returning teachers for the 2016-2017 school year.

That the Board of School Directors adopts the following resolution which sets the instructional calendar for the 2016-2017 school year and designates Section 1502 and Act 80 days as part of the approved calendar.

The current agreement between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District and the Tredyffrin/Easttown Education Association states that "the teacher work year will begin no earlier than the Monday before Labor Day for each year of this Agreement." This MOU will move the earliest first day for returning teachers to Wednesday, August 24, 2016. This change will be in effect for the 2016-2017 school year only.

The Board Education Committee has reviewed the 2016-2017 instructional calendar after consideration of input from the school community. The Pennsylvania School code governs the Board approval of Section 1502 Local Holidays and Act 80 Non-Instructional School Days. These days are noted in the accompanying resolution and 2016-2017 school calendar.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District and the Tredyffrin/Easttown Education Association

This Memorandum of Understanding shall serve as an amendment to Section 4 ("Other Terms and Conditions of Employment") of the 2014-2017 Collective Bargaining Agreement. This MOU replaces the previous MOU signed on October 22, 2014.

It is hereby agreed by and between the Tredyffrin/Easttown School District (the "District") and the Tredyffrin/Easttown Education Association (the "Association") that the first two paragraphs of Section 4.01 will be amended by this Memorandum of Understanding.

The teacher work year for 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 shall consist of 191 days. One hundred eighty-two (182) of these days will be scheduled as instructional days for students, including a full instructional day for students on the first student day. For teachers returning to the District, the work year shall begin in accordance with the calendar developed by the District's Education Committee after consultation with the Association. For the 2014-2015 school year, it is understood for teachers returning to the District, the teacher work year will begin no earlier than the Monday before Labor Day. For the 2015-2016 school year, for teachers returning to the District, the work year will begin on August 26, 2015. For the 2016-17 school year, for teachers returning to the District, the work year will begin on August 24, 2016.

In each school year, there will be nine (9) days of professionally related activities allotted as described below. For the entire staff, one (1) work day designated by the District Administration for building opening activities, one (1) work day designated by the District Administration for building closing activities, one (1) full parent conference day scheduled at date and times determined by the District Administration, and six (6) professional development days with scheduled activities to be determined by the District Administration.

The District will schedule Summer Academy during the week prior to or, in the 2015-16 school year, the week of the start of the year for returning teachers. Newly hired Employees shall be required to work up to a maximum of five (5) days for the purpose of orientation. Pay for these days shall be at the workshop rate as established in Section 2.09 of this Agreement.

This Memorandum of Understanding is not precedent setting. The amended language of Section 4.01 set forth in this MOU shall expire June 30, 2017.

WHEREAS, by this Resolution the Board designates five (5) days as local holidays in the Board's adopted school calendar as official local School District holidays;

WHEREAS, the Board designates eighteen (18) days under the Act 80 provision of Section 1504 of the Pennsylvania Public School Code of 1949 and requests approval by the Secretary of Education of preplanned activities schedule to occur instead of instructional time;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves as follows:

- 1. The following five (5) days are designated as local holidays in the 2016-2017 school calendar adopted by the Board: November 25, 2016; December 26, 2016; December 27, 2016; December 30, 2016; and April 14, 2017.
- 2. The following eighteen (18) days are designated as Act 80 days in the 2016-2017 school calendar adopted by the Board:

Kindergarten AM and PM Sessions (5): August 29, 2016, August 30, 2016, August 31, 2016; September 1, 2016; and September 2, 2016 for Kindergarten Student Screening and Parent Conferences;

Elementary (2): one-half days for Parent Conferences on November 21, 2016 and March 1, 2017;

Elementary and Middle School (3): one-half days for Parent Conferences on November 22, 2016; March 2, 2017; and March 3, 2017;

All schools (1): full day for Parent/Teacher Conferences on November 28, 2016.

All Schools (6): full day for Staff Inservice on August, 25, 2016, August 26, 2016, November 8, 2016, April 17, 2017, May 16, 2017, and June 13, 2017.

All schools (1): one-half day for Staff Inservice on June 12, 2017.

3. The Board reserves the right to alter the calendar when the alteration is in the best interest of the District.

Temporary Professional Employees

All temporary professional employees shall be rated twice each year for three years in accordance with procedures established by the Superintendent of Schools using District appraisal forms approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. In the event of an unsatisfactory rating, written notification shall be provided to the employee within five days following the final observation.

Professional Employees

An evaluation of the services rendered by each professional employee shall be made at least once annually in accordance with procedures set forth in the accompanying regulation. In the event of an unsatisfactory rating, written notification shall be provided to the employee within five days following the rating, and the employee shall undertake a Professional Improvement Plan.

Internet and Computer Network Safety and Use

The District recognizes that the ability to use the information and communication resources provided by the Internet and other computer networks is an essential skill for students in preparation for higher education and the workplace. The District will provide education about the use of the Internet and other resources and appropriate access to them. Technology provides access to computers and people worldwide including some materials not appropriate for an educational setting. Therefore, class access will be provided under supervision of an appropriate staff member.

Individual student access will be offered to all students only after students have submitted the completed Network Acceptable Use Agreement. Individual users of the District computer networks are responsible for their behavior and communications over these networks. Independent, yet monitored, student access to Internet services will occur in grades 5 - 12. The administration is authorized to provide Email email services will be provided to Conestoga High School students and District middle school students who agree in writing to act in a considerate and responsible manner. The parents of all Internet users grades 5 - 12 will be notified of guidelines for student Linternet use. K - 4h grade students may access the Internet only under supervision of a staff member or supervised volunteer. Students may not disclose or disseminate personal identification information about themselves or others when using the Internet, email communications or other forms of direct electronic communications. In compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act, the District will educate minors about appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking websites and in chat rooms, and cyberbullying awareness and response.

Blocking software will be used on the Internet in an attempt to protect minor students from obscene material, child all-pornography, including but not limited to child porronography, other visual depictions deemed harmful to minors (as defined by the Children's Internet Protection Act), and other categories deemed necessary by the administration (see Regulation 6190). Other Internet users will also have these categories blocked. An administrator, supervisor, or person authorized by the Board may disable the technology protection measure if needed for *bona fide* research or other lawful purpose.

All students and staff members will sign the Network Acceptable Use Agreement and comply with District standards or lose their access privilege. The Information Services Department regularly monitors its network for unauthorized access or unlawful activity on District network computers and servers. Inappropriate, unauthorized or illegal use (including hacking or attempted hacking) may result in the cancellation of the offender's privileges. Appropriate legal and disciplinary action may be taken.

Selection and use of information and instructional materials through electronic media shall be consistent with Policy 6136 *Controversial Issues in the Curriculum* and Policy 6160 *District Selection and Review of Instructional Materials*.

Service Animals in Schools

Purpose

"Service animal" is defined in the accompanying regulation. The Board adopts this Ppolicy to ensure that individuals with disabilities, as defined in the accompanying regulation, are permitted to participate in and benefit from District programs, activities and services through the use of service animals as defined in the accompanying regulation, and to ensure that the District does not discriminate on the basis of disability.

Definition

"Service animal" means any guide dog, signal dog, or other animal individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability. The work or tasks performed by a service animal shall be directly related to the individual's disability. Examples of work or tasks include, but are not limited to, assisting individuals who are blind or have low vision with navigation and other tasks, alerting individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing to the presence of people or sounds, providing nonviolent protection or rescue work, pulling a wheelchair, assisting an individual in connection with a seizure activity, alerting individuals to the presence of allergens, retrieving items such as medicine or the telephone, providing physical support and assistance with balance and stability to individuals with mobility disabilities, and helping persons with psychiatric and neurological disabilities by preventing or interrupting impulsive or destructive behaviors. The provision of emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship does not constitute work or tasks for the purpose of this definition.

Delegation of Responsibility

The Board shall permit individuals with disabilities to use service animals in District buildings, on District property, and on vehicles that are owned, leased or controlled by the District, in accordance with this policy and applicable state and federal laws and regulations. The Superintendent or designee shall develop and disseminate administrative regulations to implement this Board policy and accommodate individuals with disabilities requesting use of a service animal in District buildings and on District property and vehicles.

Consistent with state and federal laws, Tredyffrin/Easttown's **2015-2016** English as a Second Language Program strives to meet the special needs of students whose primary language is not English. The goal of the program is to increase the proficiency levels of English Language Learners (*ELL*) in the skill areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing through daily interaction with their ESL teacher who serves as their primary Language Arts instructor.
