# From an Encyclopedia

Encyclopedia. Date. Volume. page(s) used. Example: World Book. 2001.Vol. O. p.314.

## From the Internet

"Article Title". www.address.com. date you visited the site. Example: "Smartest 4th Grader Ever". www.kidzworld.com/site/ p4445.htm. January 6, 2011.

# From an "Expert"
