#### Health Curriculum Reminder: Signs Of Suicide Program

Conestoga is offering depression awareness and suicide prevention training as part of the health wellness curriculum using information from a research-based program, the Signs of Suicide (SOS) Prevention Program.

Ninth grade students will take part in the SOS program during the mental health unit of their Health & Fitness course. Ninth grade students who had Health & Fitness in the fall took part in the SOS program this past fall. Ninth graders currently enrolled in health for the spring semester will take part the week of April 13, 2020.

Health teachers will deliver SOS program instruction, including a DVD entitled "Friends for Life" and related follow-up discussions. A member of the school counseling team will be present during and after the lessons to collect confidential response cards voluntarily completed by students who feel that they or a friend might need help. Counseling team members will also provide immediate, confidential follow-up for any students requesting help after the SOS lessons.

Our goals in presenting this course content using the SOS Prevention Program are:

- To help students understand that depression is a treatable illness.
- To explain that suicide is a preventable tragedy that often occurs as a result of untreated depression.
- To provide students training in how to identify serious depression and potential suicidal thoughts in themselves or a friend.
- To impress upon youth that they can help themselves or a friend by taking the simple step of talking to a responsible adult about their concerns.
- To help students know which adults in the school they can turn to for help, if they need it.

When serious weather conditions or other emergencies make it necessary to close or delay the opening of schools, announcements will be made on the TE All-Call Mass Communication System, the TESD website, the T/E Information Hotline - (610) 240-1970, T/E TV on Comcast Cable Channel 14 and Verizon Channel 20, as well as on local television stations.

#### Reminder to 11th Grade Parents/Guardians From the Health Office

The Pennsylvania School Act requires that all students in 11th grade receive a medical examination. Please include an updated immunization record with your physical exam. Effective 8/1/17 all students entering 12th grade will be required to have **2** doses of MCV (Meningitis), one which needs to be at/after age 16. Please check with your health care provider at the time of your physical examination.

### Host a Student Through AFS

For over 50 years, Conestoga has been enriched by AFS students. In the past few years, students from Australia, Argentina, Austria, Brazil, China, Spain, Germany, Norway, France and Switzerland introduced their cultures to our community. Could you be a host parent for a semester or year next year? Students are interviewed and selected by officials in their home countries and are matched with screened families here. All students come with full medical insurance and spend their own money. Host families vary widely in size, age, and income level. Requirements for hosting are curiosity about other cultures, a sense of humor, flexibility, and a willingness to open one's home and heart to a student from another country as a regular family member. Placements are available for either one or two semesters.
