AP Exam Registration is Open!

By now, all students should have signed in to myap.collegeboard.org and confirmed their exam decision by October 15, 2019. Payment for AP Exams will be collected October 18th-October 31st. An invoice will be sent to each family via email on October 18th.

- AP Exam Fees: \$94/exam (AP Research and AP Seminar Exams \$124/exam)
 - \$40 late fee/exam for orders received after October 31st
 - \$40 cancellation fee/exam for cancellations after October
 31st
- The fee may be paid by check or online.
 - To pay by check, submit a check (payable to CHS AP Fund) to the AP Registration Box in Student Services by

- October 31, 2019. Please write your student's name on the memo line.
- To pay the fee online: Please note that the service provider charges a convenience fee.
- 1. Visit <u>www.officialpayments.com</u>
- 2. Click "Local Payments."
- 3. Type 4841 in the Jurisdiction Code field and press enter, or enter state and payment entity.
- 4. Select "CHS AP Exam Fee" from the Payment Type drop down menu and click "Make a Payment."
- 5. Enter the student name.
- 6. Enter the amount due for each child in the family who will take an AP Exam this school year. Then select the payment type and click "Continue."
- 7. Follow the on-screen instructions to create an account and make a payment.

The Allied Health program is highly regarded for seniors who enroll in the 7.5 hour per week college prep program. Students have three programs to choose from: Hospital, EMT, or Sports Medicine. Students are offered placement location based upon availability and merit.

The Teacher Academy program is a program for seniors who are interested in a career in the education field. Students focus on cultural/linguistic awareness, integration of technology in the classroom, special education and response to instruction and intervention, and the Standards-Aligned System (SAS) approach to instruction.

National Honor Society Induction Ceremony

November 6, 2019

The Conestoga Chapter of the National Honor Society will hold its annual induction ceremony on Wednesday, November 6, 2019 at 6:00 PM in the Auditorium. As specified by its national charter, NHS members are chosen on the basis of scholarship, service, leadership and character. They participate in various service projects in school and in the community. Students who have completed at least one full semester at CHS by the end of their sophomore or junior year are considered for membership. For the Classes of 2020 and 2021, a cumulative weighted GPA of 4.70 or higher is required for eligibility. Students who have achieved this GPA will receive letters inviting them to complete the activity form/application.

Candidates are reviewed by a five member faculty council on the basis of the four factors noted above. Students who meet the criteria of the organization are invited to attend the ceremony and become members of the NHS. Following induction, members of NHS are required to uphold the highest standards of character, leadership, service, and academic achievement. They are also required to attend monthly meetings and participate in service projects. Signs Of Suicide Program

Conestoga offers depression awareness and suicide prevention training as part of the health wellness curriculum using information from research based program, The Signs of Suicide® (SOS) Prevention Program. The program has proven to be successful at increasing help seeking behaviors by students concerned about themselves or a friend. It is the only school-based suicide prevention program listed by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration for its National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices that addresses suicide risk and depression, while reducing suicide attempts.

On November 20 and 21, health teachers will deliver SOS program instruction, including a DVD entitled "Friends for Life" and related follow-up discussions. A member of the school counseling team will be present during and after the lessons to collect confidential response cards voluntarily completed by students who feel that they or a friend might need help. Counseling team members will also provide immediate, confidential follow-up for any students requesting help after the SOS lessons.
