	Parents who have registered their child for Early Drop-Off may bring their child to school between 8:30 - 8:45 a.m. The District- provided Early Drop-Off option is not available prior to 8:30 a.m.
Visitors / Volunteers	Mitigation strategies are in place to facilitate a full in-person school experience for our students. Volunteers and visitors at Devon will be limited to essential purposes and, when possible, scheduled visits. Indoor events that involve families or groups of adults will be reduced during school hours. Please contact the school secretary, Michele Seeger, in advance with requests to visit the buildings.
Student Arrival / Drop-Off	<u>Carpool</u> – Use the carpool circle only for student drop-off. Please use the entire length of the sidewalk in the carpool line to allow more students to exit vehicles at one time.

Student Dismissal / Pick- Up (see 'Safety	<u>Dismissal –</u> To start of the year, dismissal practices as described below will be like those implemented in the last school year. We will monitor these dismissal practices and may make changes once we have a sense of how many students are dismissed in what ways.
Reminders' below)	The school day officially ends at 3:45. We expect the car line to be lengthy and ask for your patience with this process.
	Notification about Dismissal Changes - Parents who utilize bus transportation for their students must send a note to school and/or contact the Devon office (610-240-1450) to indicate a change to walking or parent pick-up. If a student is assigned a bus and we do not have a note from the parent indicating otherwise, the student will be dismissed on the bus.

	Carpool – All carpool pickups will occur in the main carpool line in the front of the building. Place a placard with student's name and grade in the front window of the car to facilitate a quick, smooth dismissal. If you arrive prior to 3:30 for pick-up, and there are parking spaces available, please park in the lot and walk to the flagpole. We can take your name and have your child dismissed to you there. This will help to reduce the number of cars backed up in the carpool line.
	Staff members will record student names on an iPad that will then display in classrooms. Students will exit out the main lobby doors.
	Walkers – Walkers will be dismissed from the main entrance and can meet their parents by the flagpole. Parents who walk to the school to pick up their child or those who park and pick up at the door should do so and wait in the flagpole area until a staff member can record your student's name. A staff member will record names via an iPad. Students will be dismissed from their classrooms to the flagpole area.
	Buses –
	Buses will be called when they arrive and students will be loaded in the bus circle.
Early Dismissal (for an appointment)	Please send a note for any early dismissals to <u>desattendance@tesd.net</u> . Park in an open parking space in the parking lot.
	Call the main office (610-240-1450) and office staff will meet you at the main entrance with your child.
Arrival and Dismissal Safety Reminders	Please refrain from using cell phones when entering or exiting the carpool area. Arrival and dismissal are a very busy times and we need everyone to be alert.
	Please be mindful to not block the buses from exiting the bus circle onto S. Fairfield Road.
	Please follow the signage and only load and unload students near the sidewalk drop-off pick up area close to the school.
	To keep our carpool line running safely and smoothly, we ask that you display the name card (with student name and grade) on your dashboard or under your visor.
	Please pull forward as far as possible to allow staff members to load several children into their cars at once. If you have to wait for your child or buckle

	them in, please pull up as far as you can to allow the carpool line to move quickly.
	Please let your child out on the curb side of the carpool circle.
	We hope to keep the line moving so everyone can get out in a timely manner.
	Please do not park and leave your car anywhere but in a lined parking spot during morning drop off or afternoon dismissal.
	Please be mindful of the stop signs, oncoming traffic in the parking lot, and the speed limit.
	Cars are not permitted in the bus circle between 8:30-9:20 a.m. and 3:00-4:00 p.m.
	When dropping students off, please form a single line along the curb and allow your child to disembark on the curb side. Please DO NOT form double lines of cars in front of the school.
Masking and Social Distancing	Wearing a properly fitting mask serves as a strong protective measure for both the individual wearing the mask and others around them. Please note information from the CDC on the importance of wearing masks (<u>here</u>) and the proper type of mask to wear (<u>here</u>).
	We will work to maintain at least 3 feet of physical distancing between students whenever possible. Physical distancing of less than 3 feet may occur in classroom activities, building transitions, transportation, lunch, or other times during the day.
	Teachers will be wearing masks during instruction when students are in the classroom, as will students.
	Current guidance from CCHD and CDC identify that for K-12 indoor classroom settings, the close contact definition excludes students within 3-6 feet of a positive COVID-19 case when both students were wearing a proper mask and other prevention strategies were in place.

Special Areas	 Art, Music and Library/Media will happen in the Art Room, Music Room, and Library, respectively. Physical Education classes will be held outside, as frequently as possible (weather conditions permitting). Band, chorus, and strings will be held to the extent possible.
Student Lunch	 Students bring bagged lunches from home or order lunch from the cafeteria via their teachers during morning meetings. Students will wear masks as they pick up their lunches in the cafeteria, and the mask-off eating time during lunch periods will be limited to less than 15 minutes to the fullest extent feasible. During the 2021-2022 school year, students will not be charged for school meals. There is still a cost for snacks. To accommodate social distancing and to facilitate necessary contact tracing, students will have assigned seats with their classes in the cafeteria. Assigned seats will be staggered so that students are at least three feet separate from each other and not directly across from one another when eating.
Recess	Recess will be held by grade level, rather than by individual class, at regularly scheduled times. Students will wash or sanitize hands before and after playground use. Masking is optional but welcome during outdoor activities such as recess, activity, or PE.
Safety Drills	Social distancing will be encouraged for all fire drills, lockdown drills and other safety drills.
